

Foot Facts

HEEL HELP

A number of conditions may be responsible for heel pain such as gout (which usually strikes the big toe joint), various forms of arthritis, and bruising from walking on an uneven surface. Other culprits include inflamed bursae (fluid filled sacs), neuromas (nerve growths), and bony spurs. Your best way to deal with heel pain is prevent it. Wear only well-fitting shoes with shock absorbent soles, warm your feet up before you exercise (limber feet are less prone to injury), and lose weight if you are overweight. If heel pain persists, see your podiatrist for diagnosis and care for the problem. Sometimes a simple anti-inflammatory medication or orthoses for your shoes can alleviate the pain.



P.S. Haglund's deformity (also known as "pump bump"), a bony enlargement at the back of the heel where the Achilles tendon attaches, is often attributed to pressure from shoes.

nty and attended school in the Eagle Lake School system. He was very active in sports, where he was recognized for the many honors he received in both junior high and high school sports.


Upon graduating from high school, "Pooh" continued his athletic goals by attending Blinn Junior College and Texas A&M University.
