rated baked goods, floriculture, farm produce, favorite recipe contest, Texana and collective hobbies.

Anyone who submits 16 or more entries will receive a free season pass to the Fair.

A special youth awards division is offered to encourage youth participation.

First, second and third place high point awards will be given to youth in each age division: Primary, Junior and Senior.

The awards consist of a trophy and cash prize. To compete, a youth must enter at least 10 items.

Each person entering items in the HED must complete an entry card.

Entry cards and fair catalogs with complete rules are available from the County Extension Office and Potters Western Store in Columbus, First National Bank in Eagle Lake, City Hall in Weimar, Heinsohn Store in Frelsburg, Nada Grocery, Sandy Creek Drive-In Sheridan, Bernardo Farm and Ranch Supply, Larry's Super Service in Garwood and Schulz General Store in New Ulm.

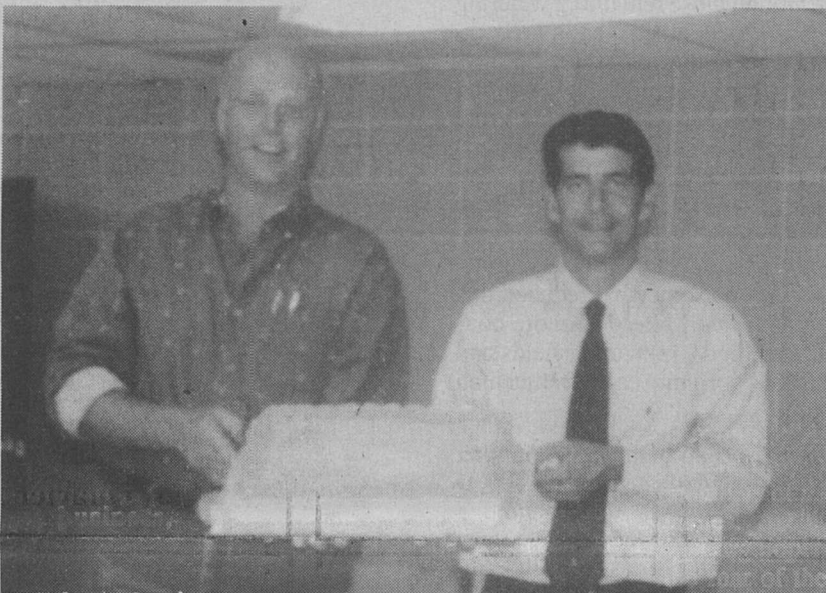

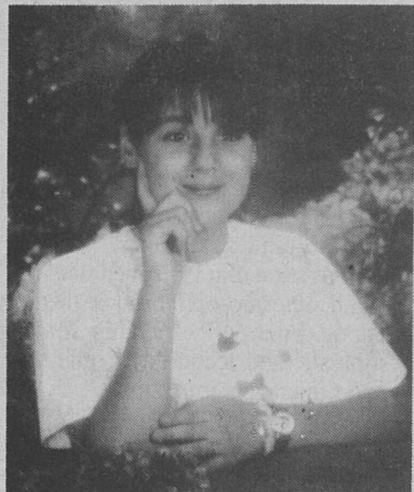


Reception honors Lanier, Hefner

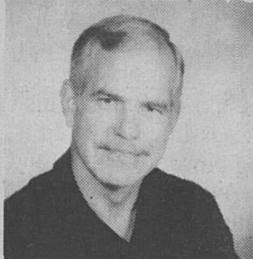
And thank you to Thelma Johnson for the lap covers.
