Hay Shows provide excellent opportunities for procedures to test hay for protein content which takes the guesswork out of feeding hay.

Samples submitted will be analyzed for protein content and judged for their physical characteristics.

Rick Leopold, NRCS Agronomist from Bryan, will present a program on grazing recommendations/fertility requirements of forages.

An evening meal will follow the program provided by Colorado Soil and Water Conservation District.

Hay samples to be entered in the hay show must be submitted on or before Wednesday, Sept. 23.

Each sample submitted will cost \$1 for the protein test.

Samples should consist of a feed bag full of hay from round bales or two blocks of hay from square bales.

Each sample should include your name, address, sample number and forage type.

Hay samples may be submitted to the following locations: County Extension Office, Columbus; Natural Resource Conservation Service Office, Columbus; Heffley's Mill and Grain, Columbus; M-G Inc. Farm Service Supply, Weimar; Heinsohn's Store, Frelsburg; Bernardo Farm and Ranch Supply; Eagle Lake Farm and Home Supply; Farmer's Co-op, Garwood; Colorado Feed, Columbus; and Family Feed, Columbus.

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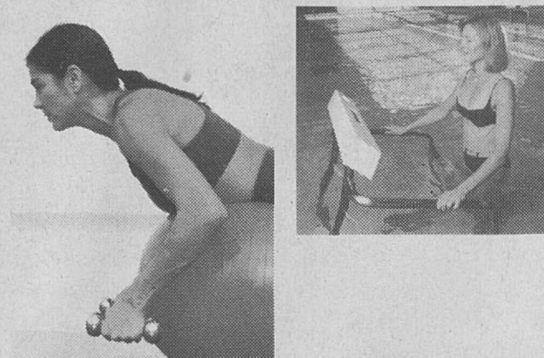
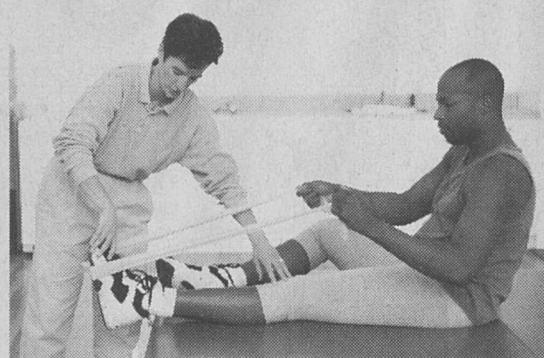
