TARSAL TUNNEL SYNDROME

Tarsal tunnel syndrome is a foot and ankle problem not unlike carpal tunnel syndrome, which affects the wrist and hand. The word tarsal refers to the lower ankle area of the foot, and the tunnel involved is the passageway through which the posterior tibial nerve passes as it runs among a series of structures including arteries, veins, tendons, and ligaments. When this nerve becomes inflamed due to an underlying arthritic problem, trauma to the area, obesity, rheumatoid arthritis, or even excessive pronation of the foot, it may cause a persistent burning pain radiating between the lower leg and the toes that does not cease when weight is removed from the foot. Ice, rest, immobilization, and anti-inflammatory medications may help.

The good news is there is no reason to continue to experience foot discomfort due to tarsal tunnel syndrome. P.S. If conservative measures do not relieve the pain of tarsal tunnel syndrome, a surgical procedure is available to help.

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Blood Pressure Medicines and Stroke

Use of blood pressure medicines in persons with high blood pressure helps prevent damage to vital organs of the body such as the eyes, brain, kidney, and heart. If not properly treated, elevated blood pressure can lead to damage to these organs. Examples of damage include heart attack and stroke. For this reason, physicians and pharmacists encourage persons on blood pressure medicines to take them exactly as they have been prescribed. One problem associated with blood pressure medicine use is not taking medicines consistently because individuals often do not feel bad at the time a medicine dose is required.

Another problem is that some people simply stop taking their blood pressure medicines. According to a study recently conducted by Australian researchers, stopping blood pressure drugs may increase the risk of having a stroke (usually characterized by bleeding in the brain and/or paralysis). According to a three-year study of persons who had bleeding strokes, persons with high blood pressure had more than twice the likelihood of having a stroke than those with normal blood pressure. Persons with high blood pressure who are at highest risk for stroke include younger adults, smokers, and those who stop taking their medicines. 9/98

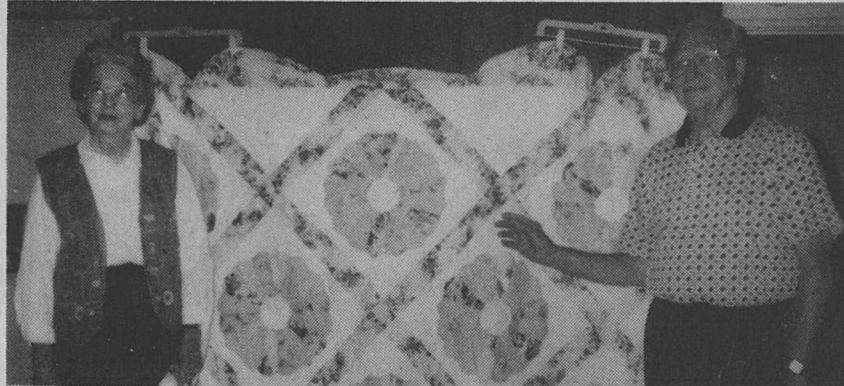
