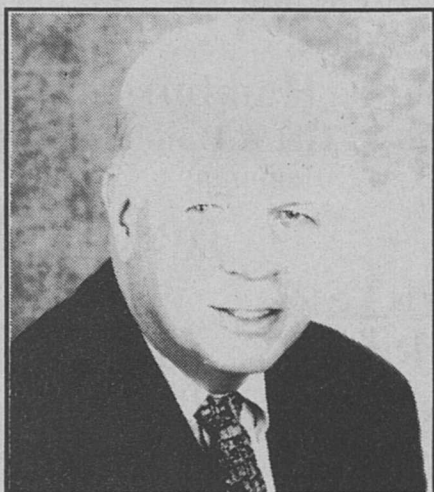

For example:

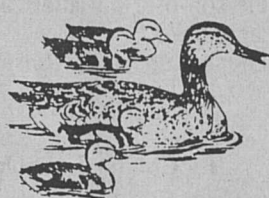
