The Recorder of Cross report by Uzzi was of crosses being worked on and asking the chapter members to recommend and encourage more crosses. Several crosses are being worked on presently.

Muggli reported on the 102nd Texas Division Convention attended by eight chapter members Oct. 1-4. The chapter was awarded several certificates. Four members were awarded the Winnie Davis medal: Muggli, Paschal, Cranek and Uzzi.

The Historical Evening was a great success with Mr. E.J. Bailey of Columbus being awarded the Cross of Military Service for service in World War II.

The Presidential Evening hosted by the chapter was a great success.

Jayne Easterling presented a gift

package from the chapter to President Muggli for her excellent work on the Division Convention. Jayne also asked the chapter to save small toilet articles and other articles to put in the Veterans' gifts for Christmas.

Emma Gene Schroeder, historian, presented Teresa Gold who gave a delightful program on "Texas German and the Confederacy". Muggli of Weimar was the Convention Chairman, Mrs. Janie Parker Price of Houston was the Co-Chairman and Mrs. Katherine Benson of Colorado County was the Convention Treasurer.

The prestigious Winnie Davis Medal, awarded to members who voluntarily go beyond the call of duty for the Organization, was awarded to Muggli, Price, Uzzi, Cranek and Paschal of Columbus. A Military Cross of Honor was awarded to Mr. E.J. Bailey, of Colorado County for his service to the country in WWII in the South Pacific. He is a descendant of a Confederate War Veteran.

A display of Texas Confederate flags which has been conserved for the Confederate Museum located at Hill College in Hillsboro, was presented to the Museum Committee. The UDC Chapters, as well as philanthropists have donated the funds for the conservation of these flags. Money is still being collected for further conservation projects.

There was an impressive parade of Chapter Flags held at the beginning of President's evening, including the new flag of the Shropshire-Upton Chapter which is located in Columbus. There were three real Daughters of Confederate veterans able to attend a luncheon held in their honor at this convention.
