Now other family members are getting in on the testing fun. "It's become common for students and parents to have a little friendly competition with the Accelerated Reader," Kazmir said.

CCY&FS schedule open house this Friday

Colorado County Youth and Family Services (CCYFS) Inc., 1336 Fannin, Columbus, will host an Open House Friday, Oct. 23, from 3 to 5 p.m. The agency is inviting the general public to attend.

"We are very comfortable in our new location and we want our neighbors, clients, business associates and friends to come by on Friday to visit us," said Dan Peavy, Executive Director.

CCYFS is a non-profit agency dedicated to promoting positive and healthy individuals and families. The agency's home office is now located at 1336 Fannin in Columbus. The agency offers services that include STAR Service, Drug and Alcohol Prevention and Intervention, Core Services and The Outpatient Treatment Program.

The STAR Service program provides timely and appropriate assistance to youth and families in order to reduce at-risk situations and stabilize the family.

The program is staffed by 6 case-workers. Funding for the STAR program comes from the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services for Austin, Colorado and Fayette Counties.

The Drug and Alcohol Prevention and Intervention Program provides substance use/abuse prevention and intervention services to Colorado County youth and their families. School based programs for all grades are offered on all the public and private school campuses.

Core Services are offered to those

persons or families who may be experiencing a problem with drugs and alcohol. Services are provided by experienced Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselors.

The Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Austin, Colorado, Fayette, Lavaca and Lee Counties provides funding for this program.

The Outpatient Treatment Program is another program offered by CCYFS.

Adult and adolescent outpatient services are available for those persons identified with a chemical dependence/abuse issue.

Funding for this program is provided by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse.

All services are available to the general public. All client information is confidential.
