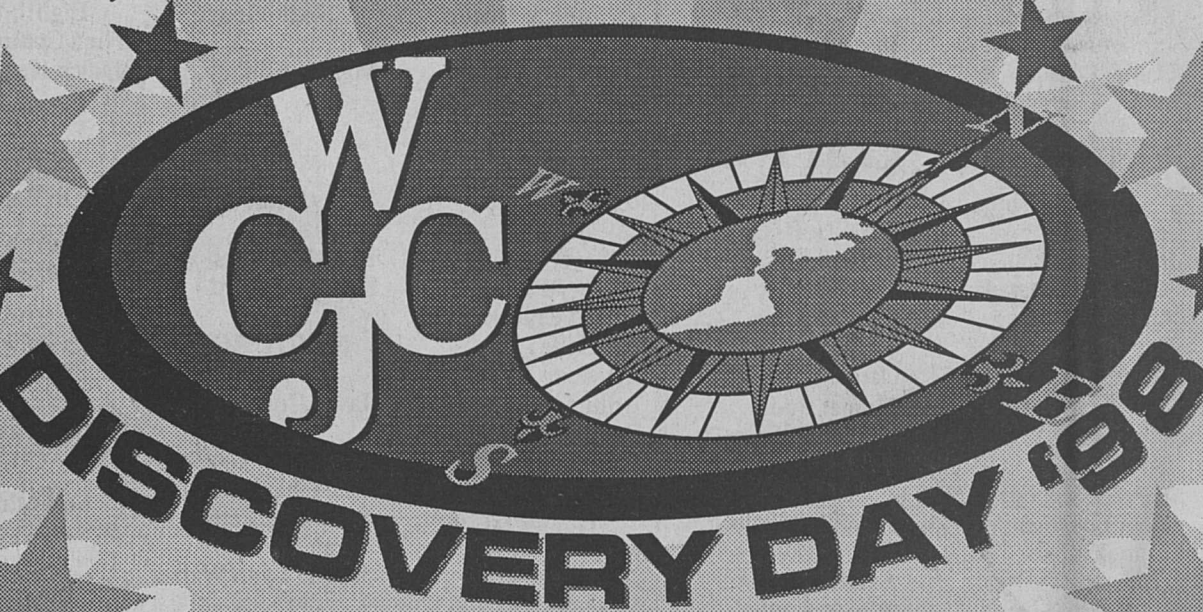

It's yours... want it back?

State Comptroller John Sharp published his annual Unclaimed Property list Sunday, Oct. 18.

The public should call 1-800-654-3463 to inquire about unclaimed money, or use the Comptroller's Window on State Government Internet site at <http://www.window.state.tx.us> to search for their name and begin the claims process electronically.

In the last decade, the state has returned more than \$300 million in unclaimed property to its rightful owners, but more than \$800 million remains unclaimed. The money comes from forgotten bank accounts, abandoned safe deposit boxes, uncashed check, uncollected wages and other sources.

The Unclaimed Property publication contains only the names of un-
