Sept. 1998

The Sept. 1998 summary for the Eagle Lake Police Department lists 179 calls answered; 98 miscellaneous, 22 disturbances, 13 thefts, 11 assaults, 11 accidents, 10 criminal mischief and four burglaries. Criminal cases numbered 28 with 151 cases being cleared. Officers handled four juveniles, made 16 arrests; 10 misdemeanor, six felonies.

During Sept., 41 citations were issued and 62 warnings given.

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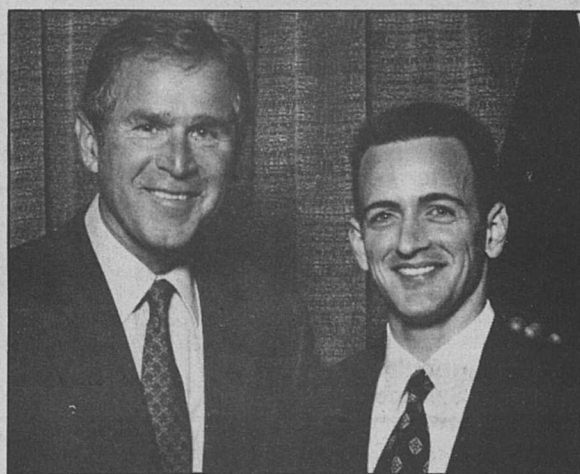
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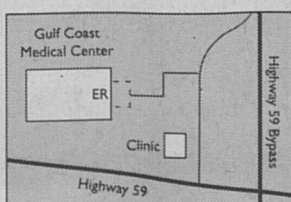
