8th grade Raiders pick up two more shutouts, lose one

On Sept. 25, the Rice Raider 8th grade football team traveled to Smithville and shut out the Tigers for their second shutout in two games, 26-0.

Offensive highlights: Felipe Rangel scored a touchdown on a reverse with the help of Reggie Ford, Ramiro Esparza and James Phillips, for 25 yards to give the Raiders a 6-0 lead.

Matt Hentzell had a seven-yard touchdown run behind the blocking of Andrew Varley, Esparza, Ford and Jason Godley to give Rice a 12-0 lead.

Patrick Milentz had an excellent day passing the ball, as he hit Michael Sosa on a 20 yard pass and a ten yard pass. Milentz also connected with Enemecio Lugo three times: on a 30 yard pass play set up by a good block by Ricky Douglas, another on a 18 yard pass play set up by another block by Douglas and the final connection resulted in a 20 yard pass play for a touchdown behind the protection given by Tyreance Dabney, Jesus Ortiz, Matthew Hinze and Rubin Leal, making the score 18-0.

Defensive highlights included: Milentz making a touchdown saving tackle, running across the field to catch the Tiger runner. On the next play, the Raider defense forced a fumble that was recovered by Raynee Rangel.

Other spotlights included Godley intercepting the ball for a 10 yard return, Douglas returning a punt for 30 yards, and Dabney returning an interception 27 yards for a touchdown. Godley converted the two point con-

version on a run to finish at 26-0.

On Oct. 1, the Raiders got their third shut out in three games against the Schulenburg Shorthorns, 26-0.

Offensively the Raiders started out sluggish but got in full gear to put some points on the scoreboard.

Defensively, the Raiders shut down the Shorthorn offense most of the game, and came up with huge stops when they had to.

Offensive highlights: Sosa, 15-yard TD reception from Milentz, Sosa, 37-yard reception from Milentz to set up the 31 yard touchdown run by Hentzell. Sosa had an eight yard reception from Milentz to set up a 22 yard touchdown run by Hinze. Milentz scored on a two point conversion run. Godley finished the scoring on a 26 yard touchdown run.

Defensive highlights included: R. Rangel had a fumble recovery, Felipe Rangel had a fumble recovery and Douglas had an interception for a 12 yard return.

The win gives the raiders a 3-0 record.

On Oct. 8, the Raiders lost for the first time this season, losing to Sacred Heart 12-16.

The Raiders played with no emotion as they were beaten on both sides of the ball.

Offensive highlights: Godley 35 yard touchdown run behind the blocking of Milentz, Hinze, Sosa, Ortiz and Juan Castillo.

Sosa scored on a 15 yard run, on a reverse play for a touchdown. Helping get Sosa away from defenders were Ford, Elizar Zepeda, Andrew Varley and Leal. F. Rangel had 16-yard and

eight-yard receptions to set up the score.

The loss was the Raiders first, and the game marked the first time anyone had scored on the defense.

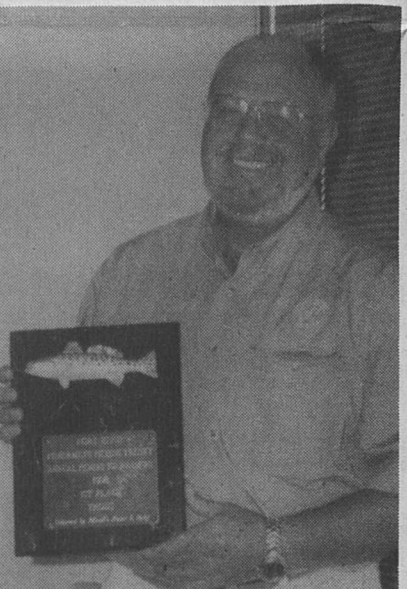
On Oct. 15, the Raiders celebrated a Homecoming victory over the Hitchcock Bulldogs 22-14.

Offensive highlights: Hentzell scored a touchdown on a 17 yard run. Hentzell converted on the two point conversion on a pass from Milentz. On the next drive, Hinze got free behind the defense and Milentz connected with him on a 65 yard touchdown. Hentzell caught the two point conversion pass from Milentz.

Godley finished the scoring with a 27 yard touchdown run.

Defensive highlights included: Hinze's 20 yard interception return, and the entire Raider defense on stopping the Bulldogs at the Raider 30 yard line with one minute left in the game.

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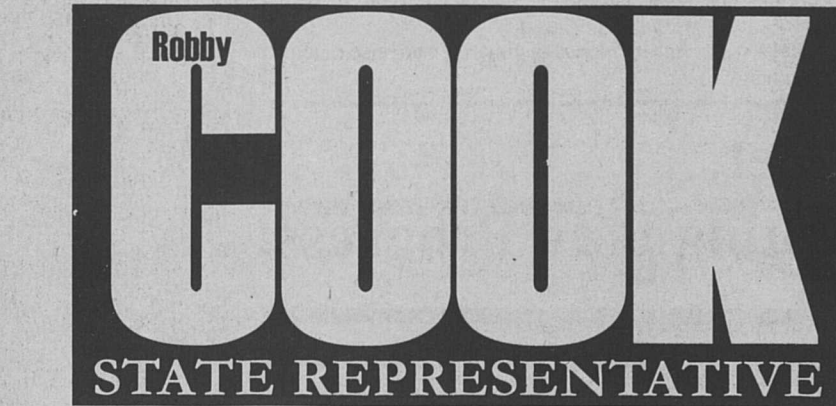
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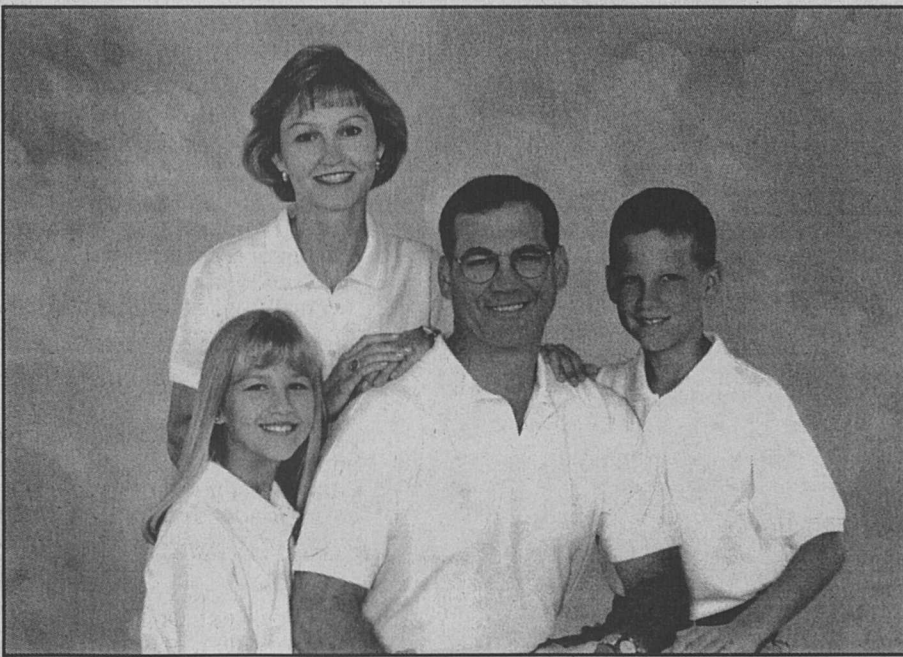
