EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

The Eagle Lake Police Department reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Oct. 26.

On Oct. 20, at 4:06 a.m., Officer Carl Risk was dispatched to a disturbance on Burns St. Upon his arrival, he discovered that no offense had occurred. No action taken.

At 6:40 a.m., Officer Tim Crume was dispatched to Raezer St. to a juvenile disturbance. The juvenile was escorted home and no other action was taken.

Officer Stephen Nelson received a report of loud music on Fairview St., at 9:11 p.m., but was unable to locate any music.

Officer Nelson was dispatched to an unwanted person at a residence on South Lake St. at 10:35 pm. The subject was later given courtesy transport to another residence.

Reyna was also arrested on outstanding warrants. After processing at the police department, the warrants were paid and Reyna was released.

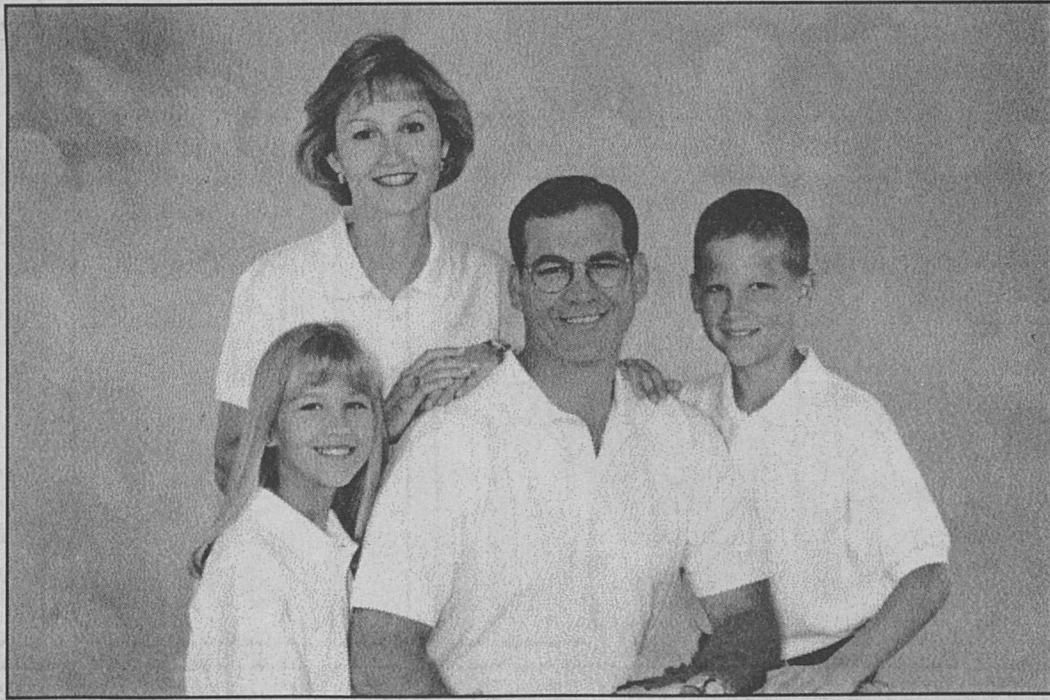
