AVOIDING PAIN

One of the best reasons to see your dentist regularly is to avoid the pain that can come with an infected tooth or gum. An infected tooth or root gives warning signals, such as sensitivity to heat, cold and sweets, etc. When the problem is an infected gum, however, there may not be any warning signs of gum trouble until a painful abscess has formed.

Both tooth decay and gum disease are caused by bacteria, although the kinds of bacteria involved are different. Avoiding these dental problems and the pain they can bring means doing what you can to prevent bacteria from adhering to teeth and gums. Good oral

hygiene at home is the first step. However, even the best of home care may not be successful. Tooth and gum problems may still develop.

The gelatinous material that covers the bacteria is called plaque. When this hardens or becomes calcified, the result is tartar, which should be removed at regular intervals to protect your teeth and gums.

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Seizures Managed with Medicines

In an individual with a seizure disorder (sometimes called epilepsy), occasionally there is an abnormal surge of brain nerve impulses which lead to a "seizure." Different areas of the brain may be affected, causing the victim to lose consciousness, cry out, fall to the ground, or have muscle spasms. Most seizures last from one to two minutes. The good news about seizure disorders is that most can be managed adequately with medication.

Seizure medicines are referred to as *anticonvulsants*. According to the publication *Drug Facts and Comparisons*, all anticonvulsants possess the ability to depress abnormal nerve discharges in the central nervous system, inhibiting seizure activity. *Phenytoin* is one of the oldest and most widely used anticonvulsants. It is used for partial and generalized (both sides of the brain affected) seizures. The drug of choice of many physicians for partial onset seizures (one side of brain affected) is *carbamazepine*. *Valproic acid* is effective in the management of partial, generalized, and absence (person affected stops and stares) seizures. *Ethosuximide* is also used for absence seizures. *Lamotrigine* (Lamictal) and *topiramate* (Topamax) are newer medicines that are used with other medicines for control of partial seizures.

Hannah Nicole weighed seven pounds, two ounces, and measured 20-1/4 inches at birth.

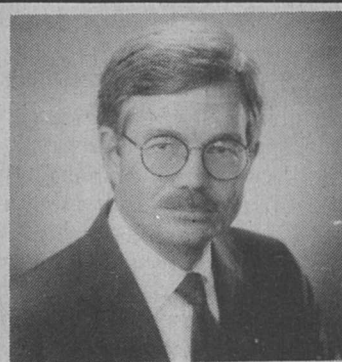
