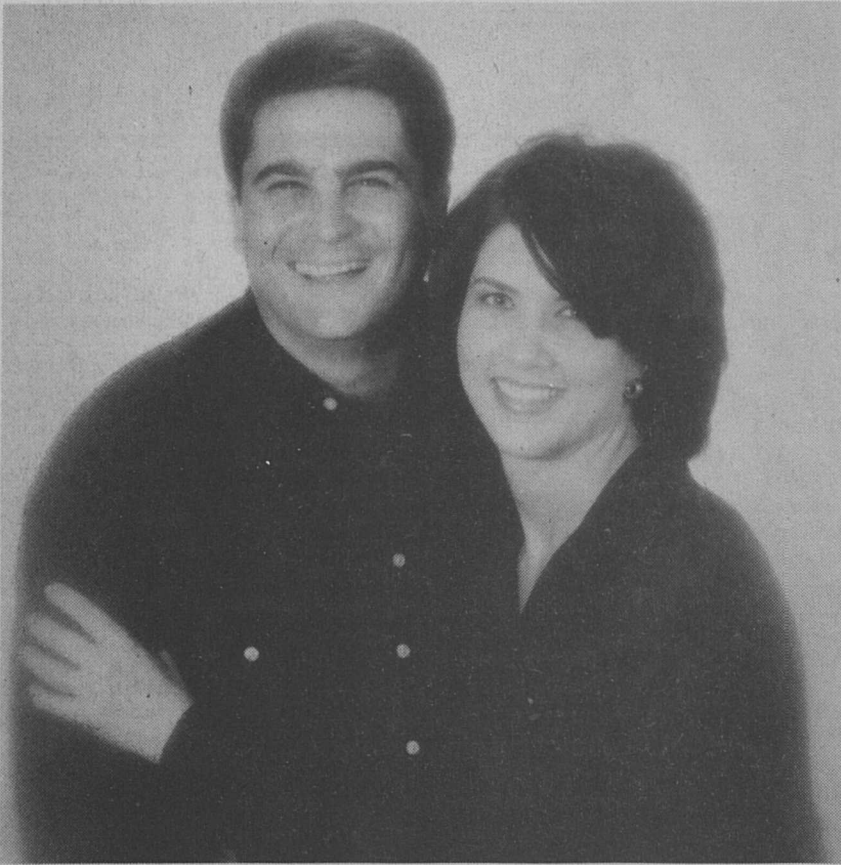




Appelt, Evans announce engagement

EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

From all the seniors at Rice, thank you to all the colleges and counselors that helped make this day possible.

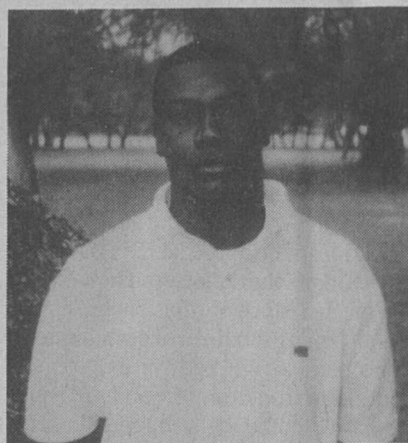


Students, Brian Cardenas, Barrett Thomas and David Rangel are speaking with a representative and signing up for information.

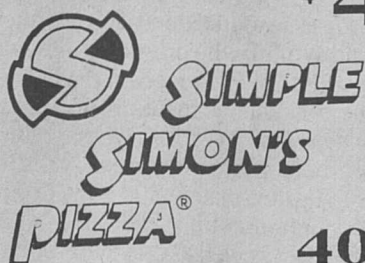

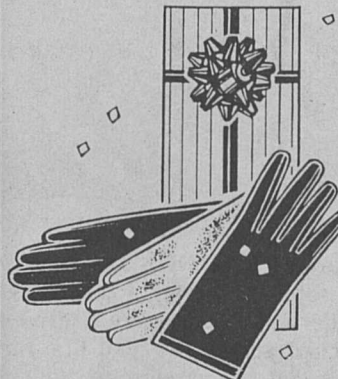
