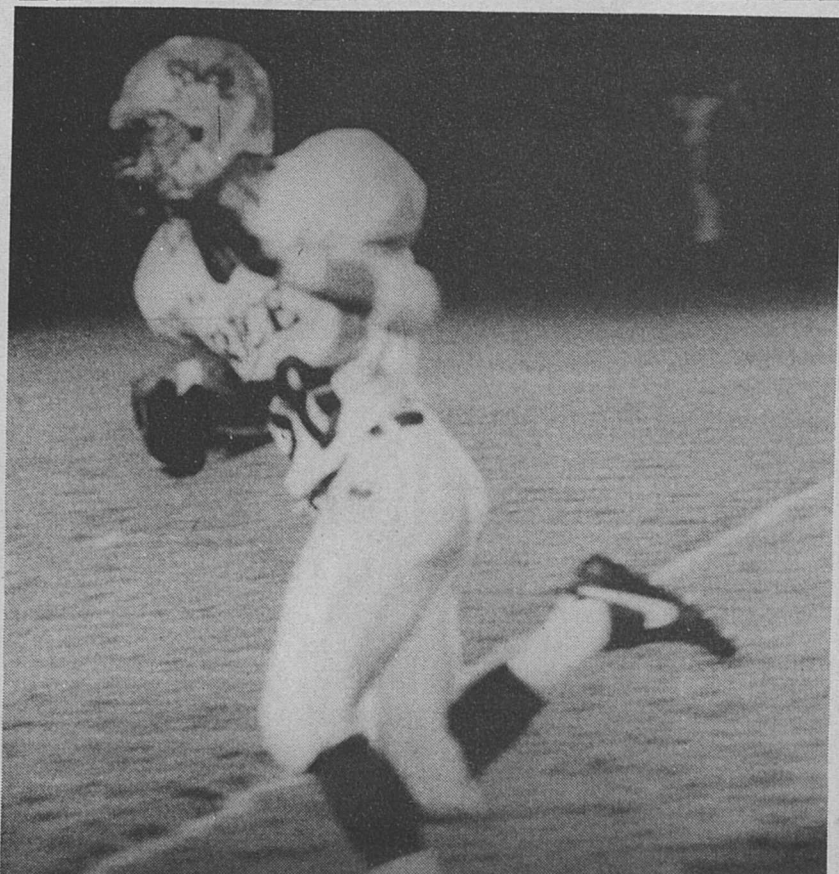

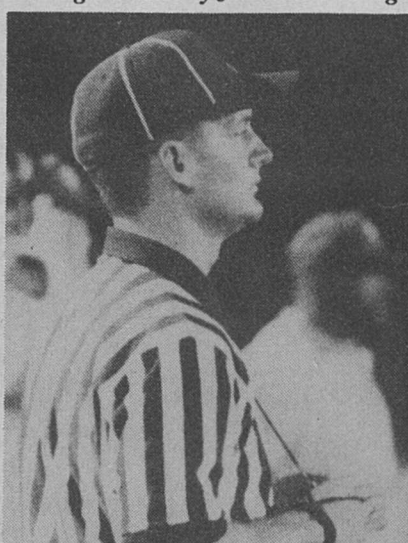

Raiders speared by Stafford Spartans, 50-22

Raider quarterback Klay Korenek passed for 115 yards and two touchdowns in Rice's 50-22 loss against Stafford last Friday night, Oct. 30.

Warren Scott broke loose for a 53-yard touchdown on the Raiders' fourth play of the first quarter.

Kevin Hoffman's extra point was good, giving Rice a 7-0 lead.

Rice scored again at the two minute mark of the first quarter when wide receiver Hank Crane crossed the goal line on a 46-yard pass from quarterback Korenek.

Hoffman's extra point kick extended Rice's lead to 14-0.

An 85-yard kick return set up a six-yard run by Tony Bostic to put Stafford on the board.

Trailing 14-7, Stafford picked up a Rice fumble and Bostic scored from two yards out in the final seconds of the first quarter.

The Spartans' two-point conversion attempt failed and Rice lead 14-13.

Rice held that one point lead until the third quarter.

The Spartans go ahead touchdown came on a 44-yard run pass from Toby Henry to Shane Steffek.

Stafford's two-point conversion failed, but the Spartans went ahead 19-14.

Stafford's second touchdown of the third quarter came from a 20-yard run by Bostic.

Henry added the two-point conversion to go up 27-14.

Mario Martinez scored the first of his three fourth quarter touchdowns to open the final quarter of play. Martinez's score came off an 11-yard run.

The Spartans added a two-point conversion pass to go up 35-14.

The Raiders' final score came with 8:20 left in the game.

After gaining a first down on a fourth down situation, quarterback Korenek hit Dale Hentzell with a 33-yard touchdown pass.

Jon Godley ran in the two-point conversion to decrease Stafford's lead to 35-22.

Stafford responded when Martinez caught a 33-yard pass.

Bostic ran in the two-point conversion.

Martinez scored again on a one-yard run. Aaron Reeves extra point kick was good making the final score 50-22.

Scott led the Raiders' ground attack with 28 carries for 161 yards and one touchdown.

Rice falls to 2-7 and 0-3 on the year.

The Raiders host Sealy Friday to end the 1998 campaign.

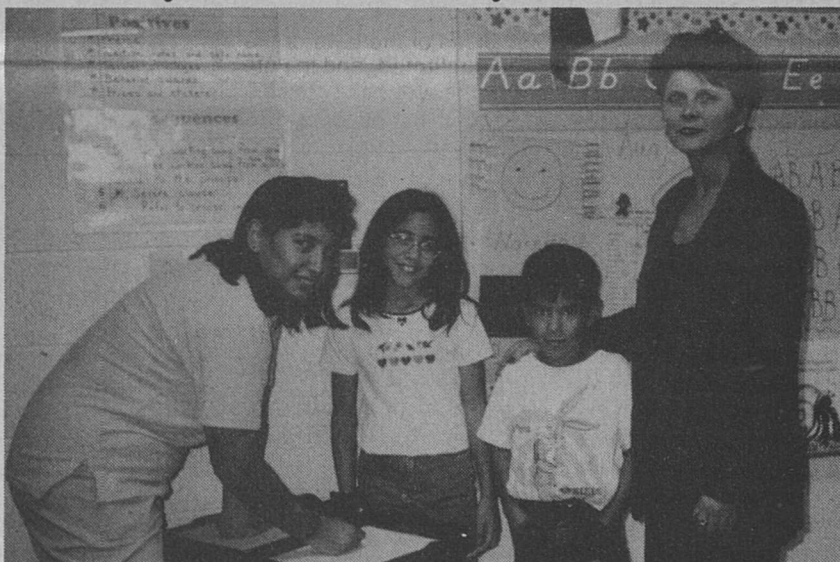
In response, the State Board of Education issued a resolution supporting both the third Annual Statewide Parent Involvement Conference and Parent Involvement Day.

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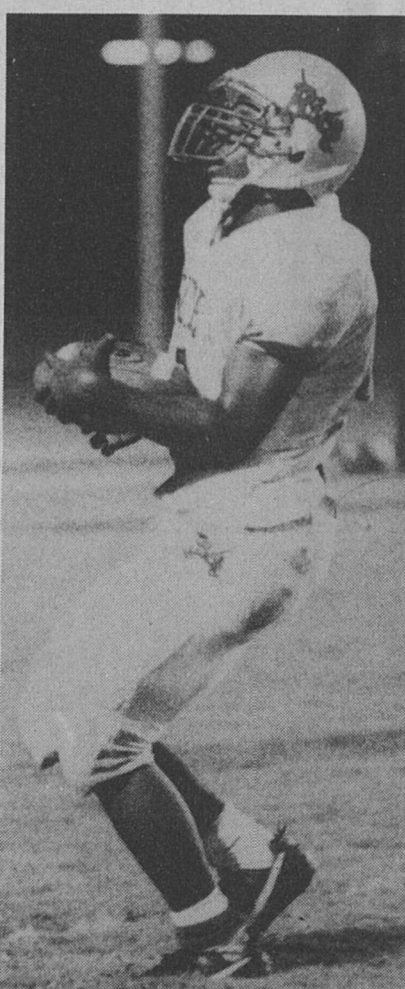
