The P.T.S. organization of Sheridan was so impressed with the response from the students and commu-

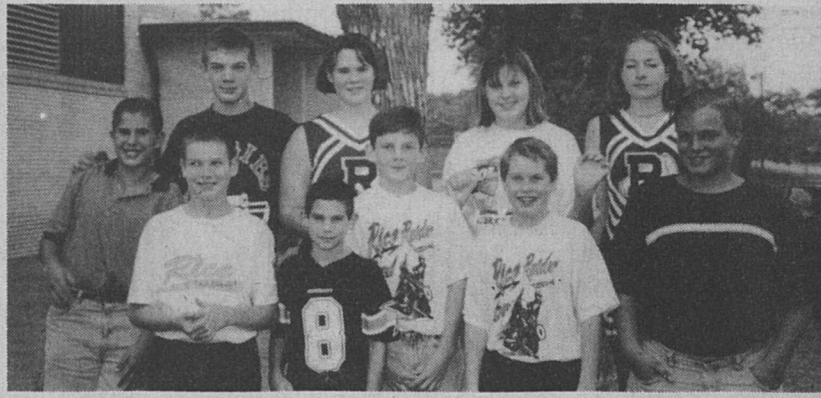
nity that they treated the entire school to a pizza party at the park pavilion Wednesday, Nov. 4.
