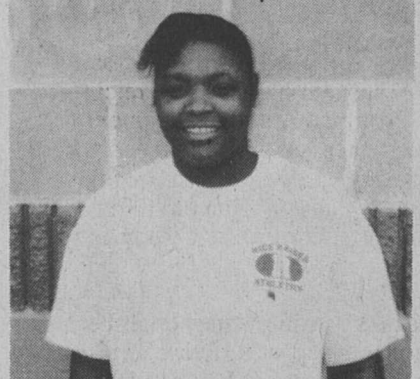

Meet the Raider

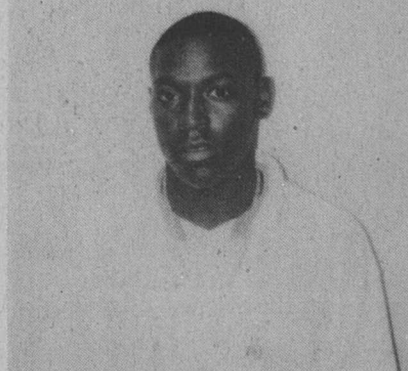

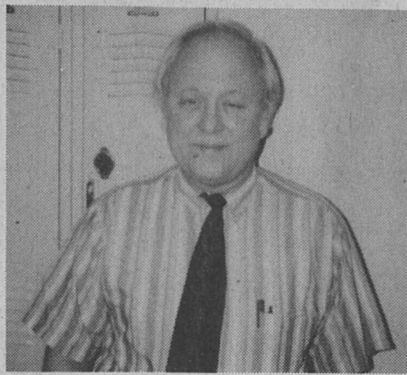
