Young athletes: eat right to win

Packing good nutrition into their busy days can help young athletes improve their performance.

"A high-carbohydrate diet will

provide the energy young athletes need," said Dr. Debby Demory-Luce, nutritionist with the Children's Nutrition Center at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Carbohydrates stored in the body provide the energy muscles need to get off to a quick start.

Iron and calcium are of particular importance for young female athletes to prevent anemia and to build strong bones.

Also, don't forget the water. Four ounces of water every 15-20 minutes during practice will head off dehydration. (See Health, Page 5)
