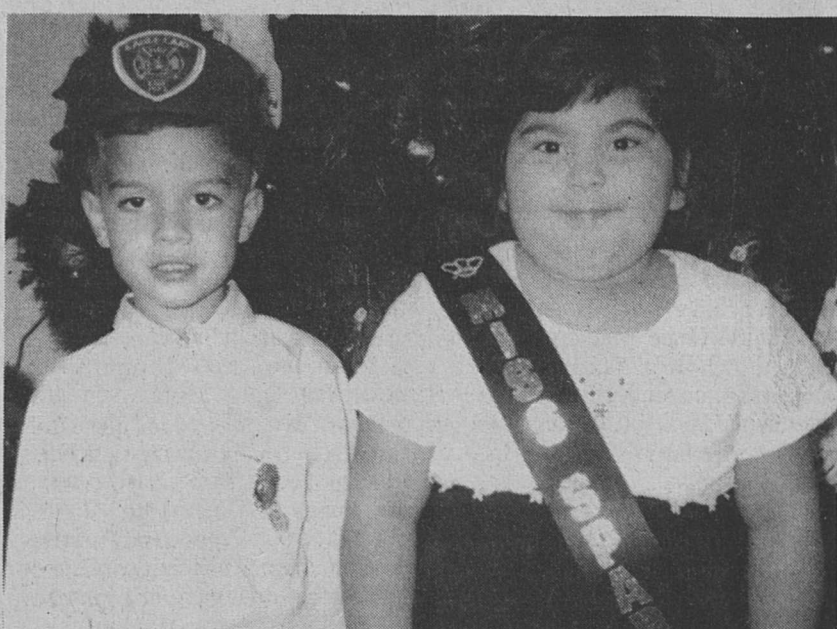

is currently practicing at Rice Medical Center, Columbus Community Hospital and Colorado-Fayette Medical Center, all located in Colorado County.

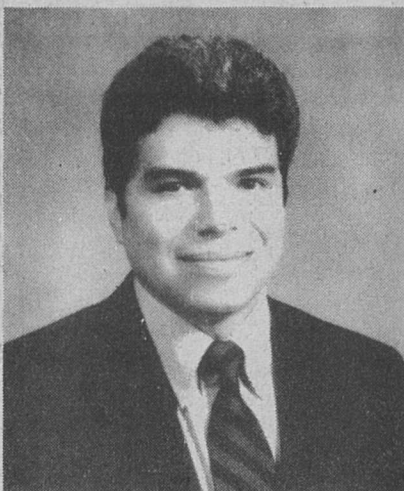
In 1997, Arebalo received board certification from the American Board of Surgery. He has a strong professional interest in minimal invasive surgery.
