
# Hemphill at UT-El Paso

will work to remediate TAAS skills. The software proposed will be presented at the March meeting for

According to Gott the software is designed to diagnose individual academic problems and help students individually correct problem areas.

The computer program will be in use for summer school.

"If we can get the academic problems fixed in the summer, our classes won't be so large during the regular school year," Gott stated. "With the software we're hoping to release our teachers from a portion of remediation teaching, and allow them to concentrate more on regular coursework," Gott continued.

The Board approved the Special Education Cooperative's request to purchase a building on Wallace Street in Columbus.


