Don't give up on Form 4797

Farmers and ranchers who filed Form 4797 with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and received a disqualifying notice should not give up hope, according to Charles Harbich, president of Colorado County Farm Bureau

"Last year, the American Farm Awards were given to: couple Bureau Federation worked to convince the IRS that dairy and livestock producers should not be declared ineligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) because income from the sale of breeding livestock was classified as capital gains income," Harbich said.

He said many producers who filed Form 4797 with their 1998 return received notices disqualifying them from the EITC.

"The IRS recently admitted those notices were sent in error, saying that tax forms had already been printed when the change was made and they were unable to reprogram their computers on time," Harbich said.

Farmers who filed Form 4797 and received a disqualifying notice should call the person or office listed on the notice or call the IRS toll-free at 1-800-829-1040, Harbich suggested.
