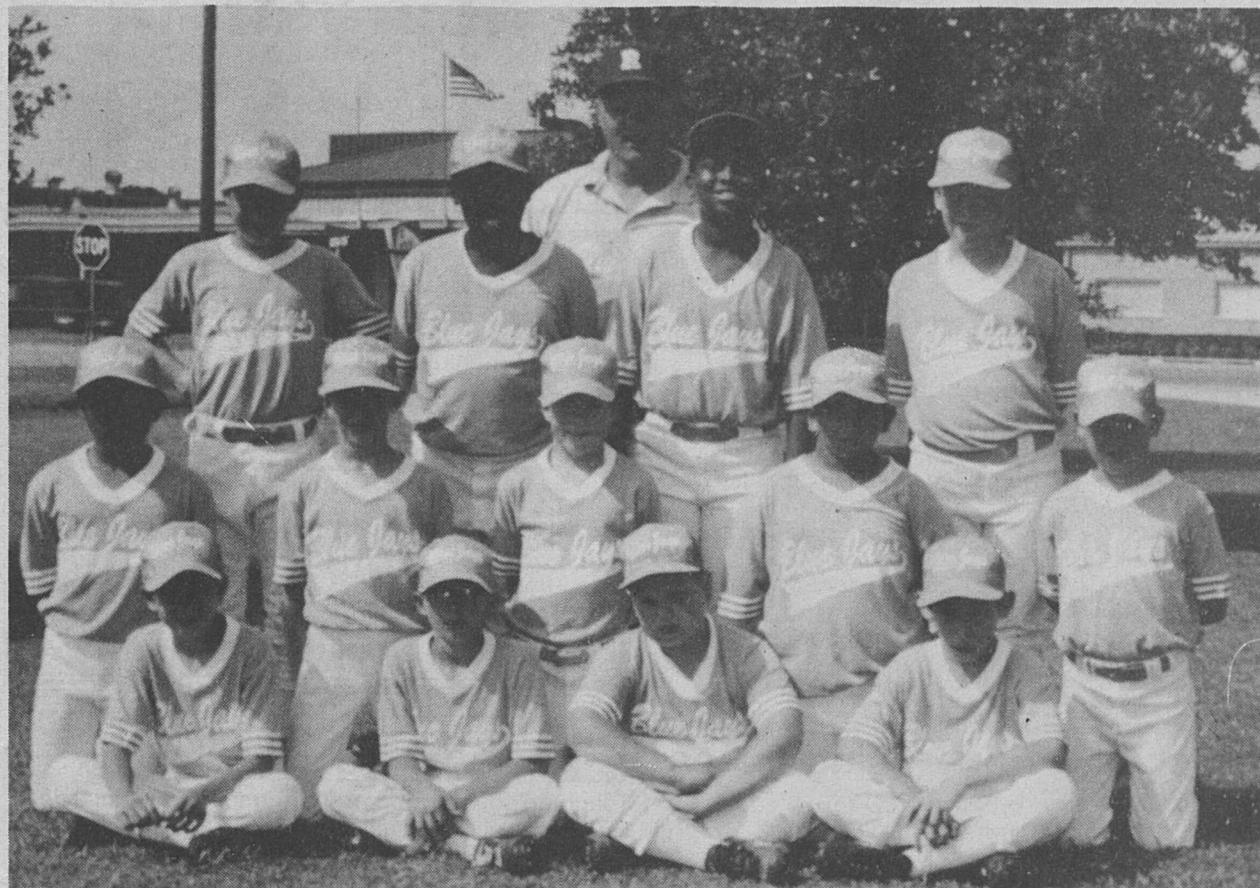

mented a search for Ramirez, 39, of Puebla, Mexico. The Task Force is comprised of agents and investigators of the FBI; Houston Police Department; Harris County Sheriff's Department; Pasadena Police Department; Texas Department of Public Safety; Harris County District Attorney's Office; West University Police; Texas Rangers; Union Pacific, Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railroad Police; Fayette County Sheriff's Department; and Lexington, Kentucky, Police.

Also, others participating in the command center (FBI Division offices in Houston) operations are representatives from local law enforcement agencies including the Weimar Police Department.

During their 10 p.m. news broadcast, Channel 2 in Houston talked to a profiler for the DPS who pointed out that Ramirez appears to be motivated by anger and power; is confident (because of the way he travels the country); and preys on persons who can't defend themselves, giving him control and, again, power.

Gerald Hildebrand, the DPS profiler, added that Ramirez leaves a "signature" at each crime scene due to his arrogance and sees this "signature" as taunting law enforcement's inability to catch him.

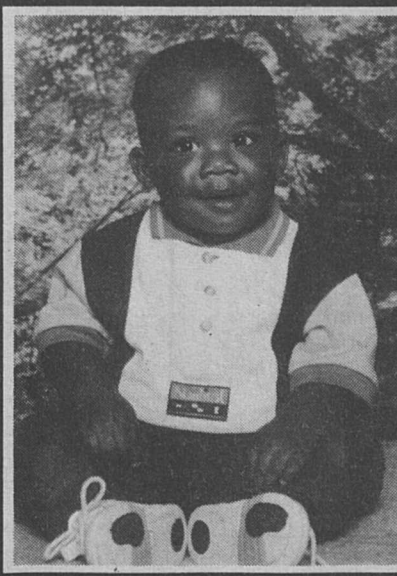

Views On Dental Health

FLU SEASON RISKY TO TEETH
