

Diabetics May Benefit from Low-Dose Aspirin

The leading cause of death in persons with diabetes is heart disease. For this reason, the American Diabetes Association (ADA) is continuing to emphasize the need for daily low-dose aspirin as a preventative measure for most adults with diabetes.

In the ADA's 1999 Clinical Practice Recommendations is the daily use of 81 to 325 mg of enteric coated aspirin. Daily aspirin is advised for persons with diabetes over the age of 30 who already have heart disease. In addition diabetics who have any risk factors for heart disease should take aspirin. Risk factors include smoking, obesity, high cholesterol levels, a history of high blood pressure, or a family history of heart disease.

Low doses of aspirin work by inhibiting the enzyme which is necessary to make a compound called thromboxane. In addition, low doses of aspirin usually are not associated with increased risk of damage to the lining of the gastrointestinal tract. However, persons who have a history of bleeding from gastric ulcers, are allergic to aspirin, or have active liver disease should use aspirin products with caution. Individuals who take blood thinners should be monitored for blood clotting activity while taking
