

Guard Shortage Identified

Texas' highest security prison, the Estelle Unit near Huntsville, was short 31 guards when a convict escaped June 27 by scaling two fences and leaping over a third.

The governing board of the Texas prison system is investigating whether the job vacancies were a factor in the escape of Dallas murderer Clifford Dwayne Jones.

Jones was captured in a tree three miles from the prison, 49 hours after his escape.

"Anytime you operate at less than 100% you risk problems," prison board chairman Allan Polunsky said in a report published last week by the Austin American-Statesman.

The shortage of prison guards has increased in the past year, according to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Starting pay for prison guards is about \$18,000 per year.
