Wayne Scott, executive director of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice since 1996, has been approved to receive a \$23,000 increase to his \$127,000 annual salary.

The new state budget, which takes effect Sept. 1, allows Scott and other agency chiefs to be paid as much as \$150,000 a year.

Allan Polunsky, chairman of the Texas Board of Criminal Justice which oversees the criminal justice agency, said he will recommend the raise for Scott.
