

Getting Ready To Go Back To School

1999-2000 ELMS Dress Code

The grooming and appearance of each student is the primary responsibility of the student and parent(s). The school staff must ensure that each student's appearance does not jeopardize the individual's health and safety nor that of others, and does not interfere with the teaching-learning process or create disorder and disruption in the school.

The provisions of the dress and grooming code shall be enforced equally with regard to all students. If the student's dress or grooming is objectionable under the provisions stated in this policy, the administration shall request the student to make appropriate corrections. If the student is not in compliance with the Eagle Lake Middle School (ELMS) dress code, disciplinary action will be taken, as stated in the Student Code of Conduct.

adopted a standard mode of dress for Eagle Lake Middle School for the 1999-2000 school year. Students are required to be in compliance with the mode of dress on the first day of school, Aug. 10, 1999.

The Eagle Lake Middle School Mandatory Mode of Dress consists of the following:

Shirts

Two (2) types of shirts will be allowed - solid color collared polo-style or collared button-front shirt-blouse (white, navy or royal blue). Insignias or logos (other than the Rice CISD Raider logo) on the shirt or shirt pockets are not allowed.

Either short or long sleeves are acceptable. Sleeveless shirts/blouses are not allowed. All shirts/blouses must be long enough to completely cover the midriff at all times and be tucked inside the student's pants, shorts or skirt.

made of a twill type materials and must be either navy blue or khaki in color. No denim or jean material is allowed. Pants, shorts and slacks should fit at the waist, not be baggy or sagging, or frayed at the bottom. Pants and shorts should fit at the waist and be regular fit (no wide-legs or baggy pants). The length of shorts should be no shorter than the bottom of the longest finger when the student is standing with arms relaxed at the side.

Skirts/Jumper

Girls may wear skirts, skorts or jumpers, either navy or khaki in color. No denim or jean material is allowed. Skirts/jumpers may be straight, pleated or full and skirts/shorts must be worn at the waist. Skirts/skorts/jumpers may be no shorter than the bottom of the longest finger when the student is standing with arms relaxed at the side.

safety and health reasons. Thongs and flip-flops are not appropriate for school. No open-toed or backless shoes will be allowed (sandals, house slipper, etc.)

Sweaters/Sweatshirts

Once the weather turns cool, a student may wear a cardigan sweater or sweatshirts (no oversized cardigans or sweatshirts) as part of the standard mode of dress in school. A cardigan/sweatshirt may only be worn over a collared shirt, either the polo style or the button-front blouse/shirt. The collar must be visible. The cardigan/sweatshirt must be solid color (navy, white or royal blue). Insignias or logos (other than the Rice CISD Raider logo) are not allowed.

Jogging, warm-ups or wind suit jackets are not allowed. No vests are allowed.

Coats/Jackets

Coats and jackets may be worn to and from school. During regular school hours, the coat or jacket shall remain in the designated storage area (we will set up a locked storage area with labeled coat racks).

When the temperature drops below 32° F., the coat or jacket may be carried with the student all day.

Dress and Grooming Code (items in current Rice CISD dress code)

1. Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance and appropriate to the gender of the student; for example, boys may not wear earrings.
2. Hats, caps, head bands, bandannas, chains and hip cloths are not acceptable and are not allowed to be worn in the building at anytime. Rakes, picks and grooming combs may not be worn in hair.
3. Hair must be kept clean, neat and trimmed to a moderate length. Sideburns must be kept trimmed and not longer than the bottom of the earlobe. All other facial hair must be shaved. Boys' hair may not extend below a dress shirt collar or be bound in any manner.
