

## MarshMALLOW Project teaches all ages

The MarshMALLOW (Marsh Management Activities for Learning the Lifestyles of Wildlife) Project is a conservation education project designed to educate youth about wetland wildlife. The project teaches youth, teachers, and adult volunteers about wetland wildlife and their habitat requirements; wetland functions, values, management, and restoration; and the important role wetlands play in our society.

The project consists of five stages: management plan, community outreach, management report, demonstration visit, and oral presentation.

Youth, teachers and adult leaders interested in participating in the project form wetland conservation clubs, locate a local landowner with a wetland, and adopt the wetland as a demonstration project. The clubs develop and submit a management plan to manage the wetland for a specific set of wetland wildlife.

A judging panel evaluates the plans and awards \$750 grants to those that qualify.

The clubs implement their plans over a period of five to six months and submit a report detailing their management activities and community

outreach steps. The clubs then give oral presentations at the MarshMALLOW Conference and Awards Ceremony.

Each club's score for the project consists of a combination of the five main parts. The top three clubs win cash prizes totaling \$2,250. The deadline to submit management plans for participation in the 1999-2000 MarshMALLOW Project is Nov. 1, 1999.

## Polio Vaccine: Switch from the Oral Expected

Vaccination is a measure we take to protect ourselves and our family members from conditions that can cause suffering and death. Polio vaccination protects against poliomyelitis and is a standard part of the immunization of children in the US and many other countries. A viral infection, polio can cause paralysis, respiratory failure, and death. Before the approval of the first polio vaccine in 1955, as many as 21,000 new cases of polio were reported each year in the US.

The first polio vaccine was made from the inactivated virus (IPV) and was given by injection. Then, in the 1960s, an oral vaccine (OPV) became available. The OPV is placed on a sugar cube and taken by mouth. A problem with OPV is that a small number of children who receive it are at risk of getting polio from the vaccine. The risk is estimated to be about 1 out of every 2.4 million doses. Up to 10 cases are reported annually. For this reason the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is now recommending that children be vaccinated with the IPV only. The goal is to completely eliminate vaccine-related poliomyelitis. The American Academy of Pediatrics is expected to update their vaccination recommendations to match those of the CDC.

**July 1999 Summary**  
The July 1999 summary from the Eagle Lake Police Department lists 261 calls including 161 miscellaneous, 41 disturbances, 17 thefts, 17 burglaries, 10 assaults, nine criminal mischiefs and six accidents.

There were 56 criminal cases with 73 cases being cleared.
