Those interested in competing should arrive prior to the event time to sign up.

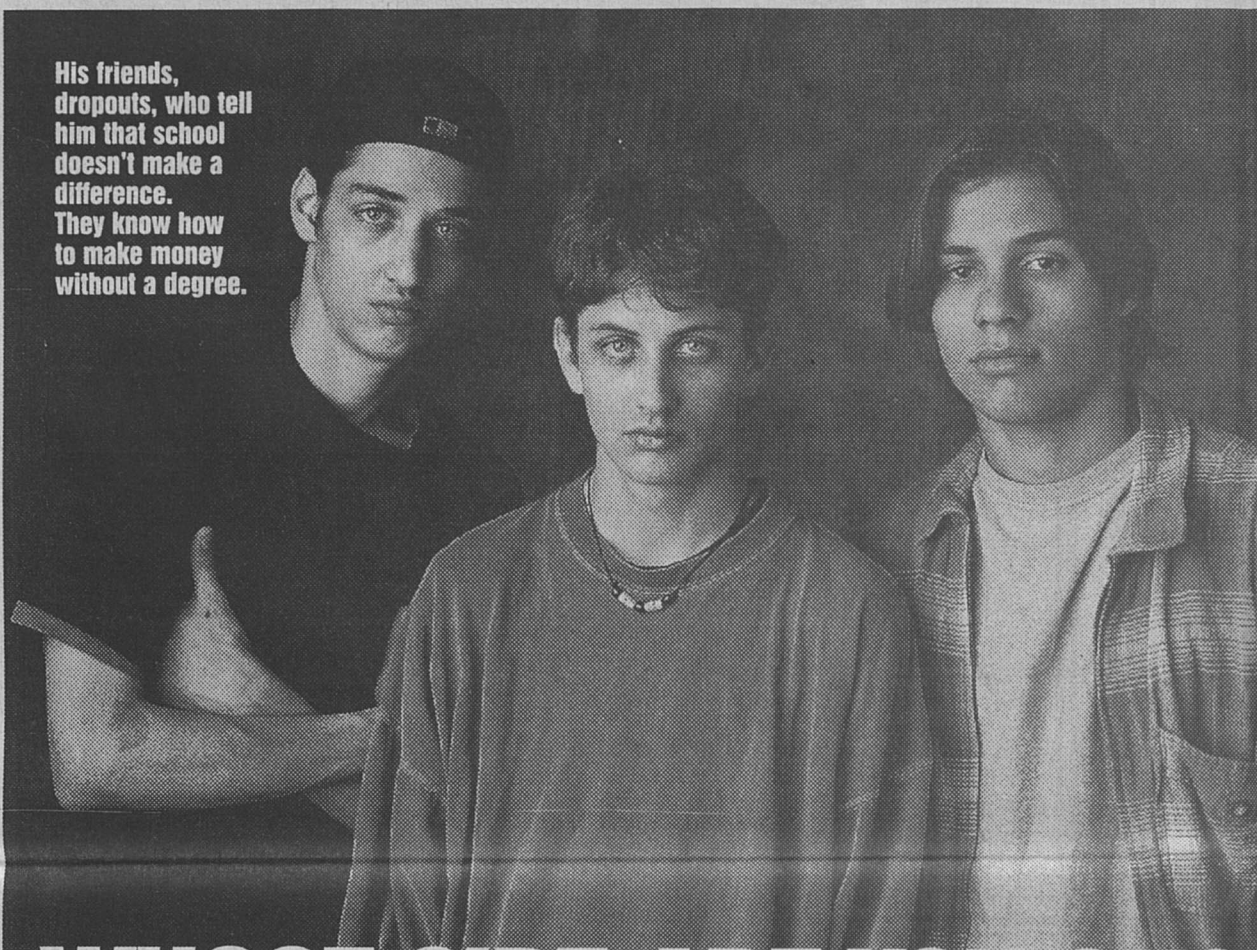
Junior boys, junior girls and women will begin their horseshoe

Washer pitching will begin at 2 p.m.

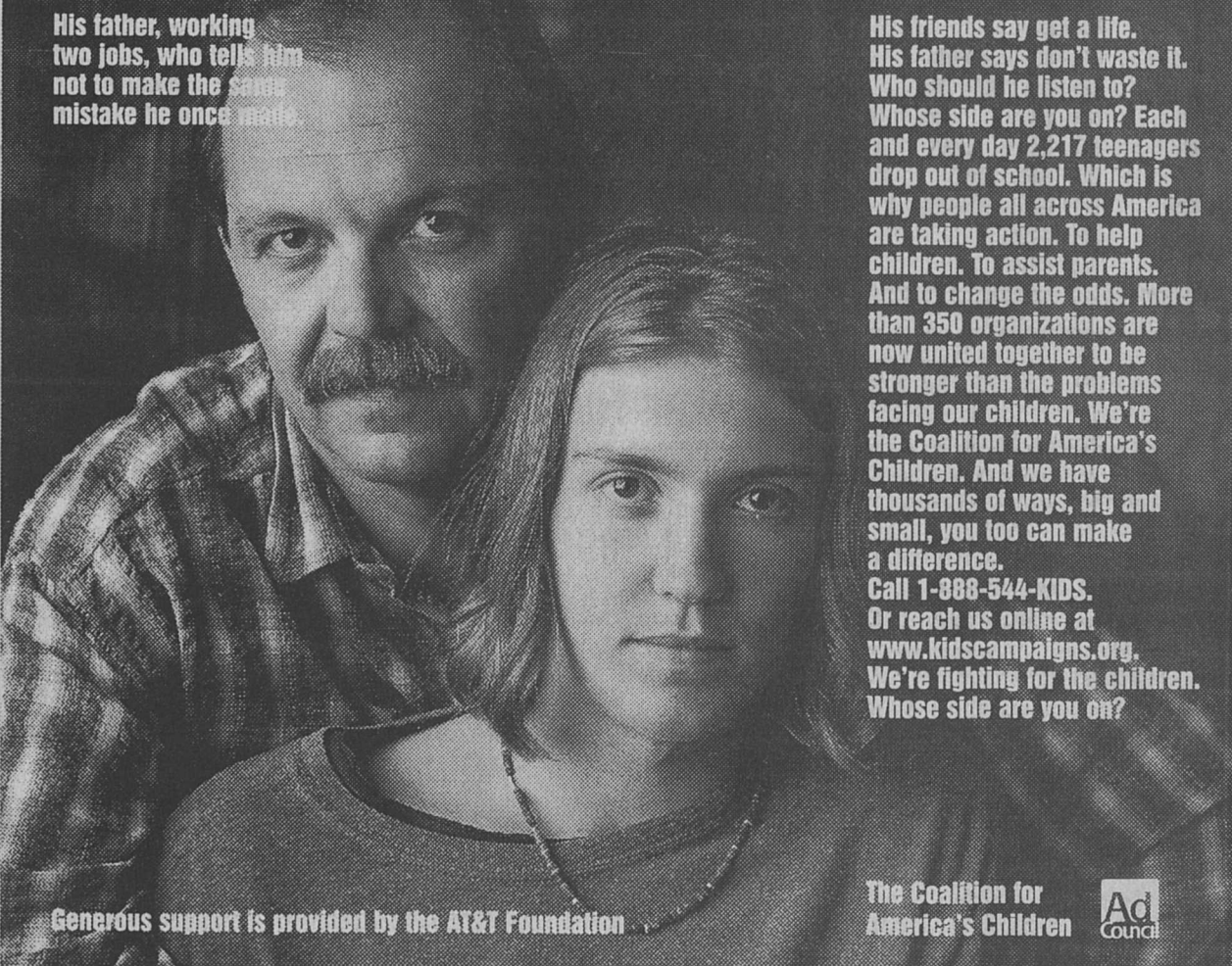

Life came to a close August 8, 1999, at 11 p.m. in the Heritage House in Eagle Lake.

Lillian Redus Dixon was born in Eagle Lake on July 24, 1907 to Mr. John Redus and Mrs. Love Jennie Roy.

She grew up in Eagle Lake and attended Eagle Lake High School until 1928, under Professor G.J. Perrino who later passed away. Professor E.H. Henry was serving as principal of E.H. Henry when she graduated in 1931 from high school.

She was married to Mr. Isaac Dix-

on. To this union, no children were born.

She confessed her hope in Christ in 1926, was baptized by Rev J.M. Martin, pastor of Friendship Missionary Baptist Church and united with St. Paul A.M.E. Church. St. Paul A.M.E. Church later became St. Paul I.M.E. Church where Mrs. Dixon remained a member until the church was torn down. She then joined Friendship Missionary Baptist Church as a "watch-care" member in 1974 under the leadership of Rev. J. Mosley. She remained under the pastorage of Rev.

J.H. James, Rev. R.J. Williams and the Rev. E. Shorter, Jr. During Rev. E. Shorter's tenure as pastor, her health failed.

Mrs. Dixon worked faithfully with members of the usher board and the Friendship staff. Other positions held were: one of 11 charter members of the St. Paul I.M.E. Church; Executive Secretary of the St. Paul Churches of Texas under both Bishop Leonard Charles Graves, founder and bishop of I.M.E. Churches of Texas and Bishop W.A. Ferguson Sr.; and mission worker in the I.M.E. Churches Northwest and Southeast Conferences.

Fraternal organizations she was affiliated with were: Heroines of Jericho and the American Woodmen.

Her parents, husband and three brothers, Archie, Jimmy and A.C. Redus, preceded her in death.

Survivors include a devoted and loving niece, Mrs. Rosie Stevens of Eagle Lake; one nephew, Murry Redus, and wife, Lisa, of Richmond; great-nieces; great-nephews; and other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held Saturday, August 14, at 1 p.m. from Providence Baptist Church in Eagle Lake with Rev. Coby Shorter Jr., Pastor, officiating.

Burial followed in Eagle Lake Community Cemetery (East).
