If you take a look around Rice High School, you will see many new faces. One of these is Coach Brad Dumont.

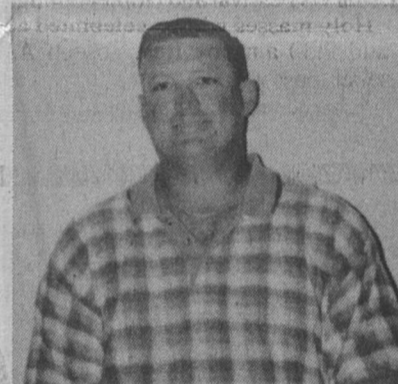
After graduating from Kenedy High School, he pursued further education at Schreiner College in Kerrville and SWTSU in San Marcos.
