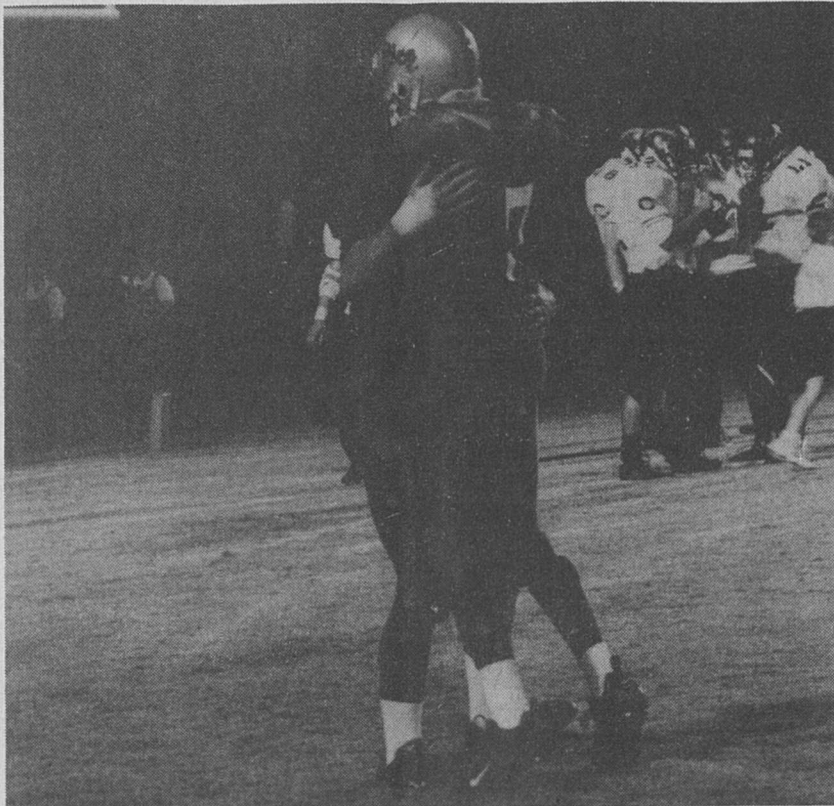

## Raiders boil Sandcrabs, 36-0

The Raider non-varsity football team traveled to Port Lavaca Thursday, Sept. 23, and had an enjoyable team meal, as they feasted on the Sandcrabs for an impressive shutout victory.

In the first quarter, defense controlled the offense, as both teams had to punt twice in a fast moving quarter. The Raiders received a Port Lavaca punt to start the second quarter and drove down the field behind great blocking from the offensive line and consistent running by the backs.

This resulted in a 20-yard touchdown pass from Patrick Milentz to Andrew Powers.

The two-point conversion was no good and the Raiders had a 6-0 lead.

This lead held for the rest of the quarter and the halftime score was a slim Raider lead.

As the third quarter was underway, the Raider "D" once again stepped it up and forced a Sandcrab punt.

The Raiders started their drive on their own 10 yard line.

After a five-yard run by Jason Godley and another five-yard run by Matt Hentzell, Milentz hit Matthew Hinze for a 80-yard touchdown pass to make the score 12-0.

Milentz hit Harley Alley for the two-point conversion to take the lead to 14-0.

On Port Lavaca's next possession, Ronnie Vasquez recovered a Port Lavaca fumble to set up the Raiders on the Sandcrab 30 yard line.

Milentz connected with Alley on a 23-yard pass on the last play of the third quarter.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Michael Cooper took the pitch and ran into the endzone from seven yards out.

The two-point conversion failed, but the Raiders now held a 20-0 lead.

On the Raider kickoff following this touchdown, Ricky Cunningham recovered a fumble to set up the offense on the Sandcrab 35 yard line.

On the first play from scrimmage, Milentz hit Powers on a curl route, then Powers pitched the ball to Cunningham for a 35-yard touchdown.

Tyreance Dabney ran in the two-point conversion to give the Raiders a 28-0 lead.

After an interception by Brian Hemphill, the Raiders used hard running by Felipe Rangel, Cooper and Dabney to set up a 20-yard touchdown run by Cunningham.

Rangel converted the two-point run and the Raiders stretched the lead to 36-0.

The Sandcrabs' last effort to get on the board was halted by an interception by Marcus Johnson, who returned the ball 25 yards.

The offense then ran the clock out to put Port Lavaca's nightmare to rest.

Every Raider should be proud of their effort. The offense once again was clicking at the right time and the defense showed the pursuit and hard hitting that had been missing last week.

A special thanks to the fans for showing their support by making the long trip to cheer the Raiders on for their third victory in a row.

The Raiders come back to Raider Stadium Thursday, Sept. 30, to take on the Schulenburg Shorthorns. Come out and support the team as they battle for four in a row!

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#### Doctors Select Safer Medicines for Use During Pregnancy

Some prescription and over-the-counter medicines often can be used safely without danger to the unborn fetus or the mother. Therefore, Dr. Sandra Kweder, Co-Chair of the FDA Task Force on Pregnancy Labeling, suggests women who are pregnant should not be deprived of medicines that are really needed. Conditions that existed before the pregnancy — such as epilepsy and high blood pressure — must be managed effectively during pregnancy. And many times medicines are needed to best manage these conditions.

It may be necessary for physicians to select medicines that tend to be safer than those used before pregnancy or to lower the doses of currently used medicines. The challenge for physicians is to consider the highest benefit to the mother and child, taking into consideration the risk involved. For example, some medicines used to treat epilepsy are known to cause birth defects. Yet, a seizure by an expectant mother can cause brain damage to the developing baby. In this situation, most health experts agree that the benefits of medicine use outweigh the risks. Fortunately, very few medicines available today in the US are thought to be extremely damaging to developing babies.
