

Czhilispel XXVII is Oct. 22-24

Flatonia will close down its main streets to celebrate Czhilispel for the 27th time.

So named for the Czech and German heritage that is a part of Flatonia, Czhilispel is a fun time for the entire family. There are many different activities all weekend, from 5:30 p.m. Friday until 9 p.m. Sunday, when the last band finishes performing.

Friday everything gets kicked off with Lost Wolf, co-sponsored by Bud Light Brown Distributing and J Bar B Foods, performing in the tented biergarten. Crabtree Carnival is also open for those youngsters who aren't interested in the dancing.

On Saturday, czhili cooks converge on the downtown area to begin the Czhili Cookoff, sponsored by Coors Light - M&S Distributing; golfers converge on the local golf course to participate in the Czhilispel Golf Tournament; runners and walkers appear to participate in the 5K Fun Run & Walk, co-sponsored by Fayette Savings and Central Texas Bank; and roller bladers come out to participate in the 1-mile Roller Blade Run, sponsored by Ken Bigham Jr. Law Firm.

Across from the czhili cooks, the arts and crafts persons open up with their wonderful array of items. The local museum is open and ready for visitors who are interested in seeing some of the local history.

Saturday also brings out the local bakers with the Lion's Club Pie baking contest. We are also able to present to you the Mobile Dairy Classroom opening for all starting at 10 a.m.

A balloon artist, co-sponsored by S&S Electrical Supply, will be bending balloons starting at noon Saturday all around the Czhilispel area.

City Polka Boys, sponsored by Oak Manor Nursing Center, will perform in the biergarten starting at 1 p.m. The local and not so local loudmouths participate in the Yelling Contest sponsored by Country World - the Rural Newspaper of Texas.

Then, brave and crazy people participate in the Jalapeno Eating Contest also sponsored by Country World. Gabbie Nolen, co-sponsored by Echo Publishing, follows them at 5 p.m. Then at 9, the Texas Unlimited Band, co-sponsored by Van Dyke Rankin, tops Saturday off.

Sunday kicks off with a Bar-B-Cue Cookoff, sponsored by Lone Star and Shiner Beer Distributing, beginning at 9 a.m. The Mobile Dairy Classroom starts up again beginning at 10 a.m. and then Fry's Petting Zoo, sponsored by Balcones Minerals of Flatonia, at 11 a.m.

Our Czhilispel Parade begins at noon. Of special notice this year are our Czhilispel Parade Marshals. We all know about the problems that we encountered this summer with the murders in the area. The Czhilispel Committee has asked our local Police Chief, Leonard Cox, Fayette County Sheriff, Rick Vandel and Texas Ranger Drew Carter to be the parade Marshals as a small thank you for all they did this summer to keep this area safe. Come out and thank them yourself!

At noon, the biergarten, arts and crafts and food booths and carnival open and the balloon artist, co-sponsored by S&S Electrical Supply, a subsidiary of Hughes Supply, begins bending those balloons again.

The Czhilispel Car and Truck Show, co-sponsored by Brasher-Gunn, is a favorite of car buffs from

near and far on Sunday afternoon.

As on Saturday, the bands continue to perform in the biergarten beginning after the parade. People's Choice, co-sponsored by Madera Paper & Drs. August Darilek and Maurice Wilkinson, will be playing from 1 to 4 p.m.

Come on down to watch the tricycle races (for the little ones only) and the Backseat Driving Mama Race, both sponsored by Kleiber Tractor & Equipment, as well as the barefoot Tug-of-War, sponsored by Colorado Valley Telephone & Subsidiaries.

Czhilispel culminates with Johnny Dee & the Rocket 88's, co-sponsored by Eddy Packing and Fayette Electric Coop. Inc., beginning at 4:30 p.m. Sunday.

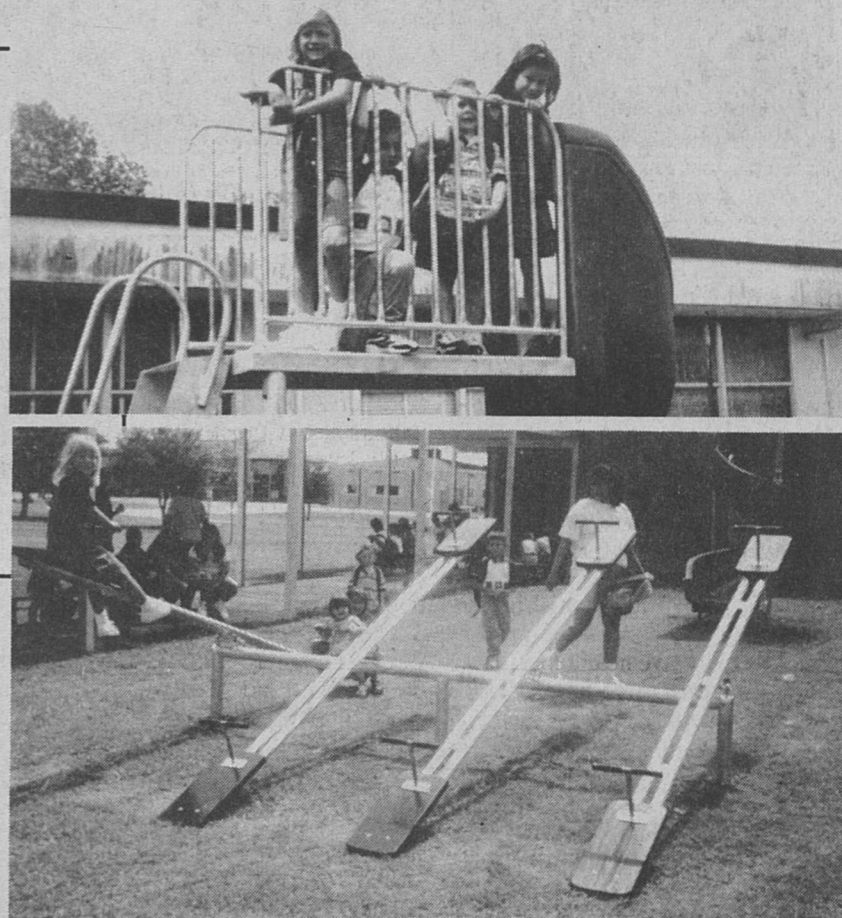
