The National Dean's List, published by Educational Communications Inc., is the largest recognition program and publication in the nation

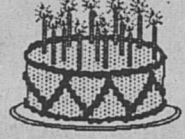
honoring high achieving college students.

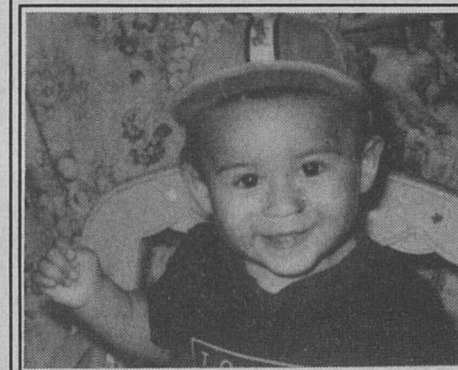

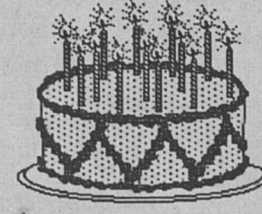

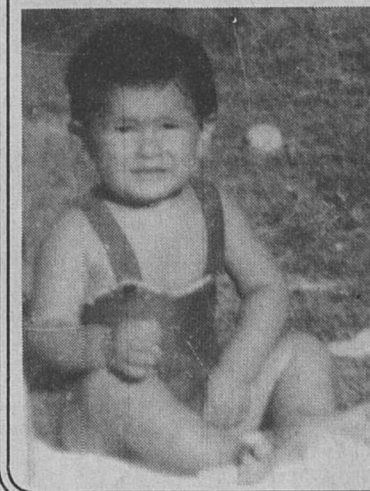

A few safety tips are:
• Look left, right and left again for cars and trucks before crossing the street even in a quiet neighborhood. Walk on sidewalks. If there isn't a sidewalk, walk on the left side of the road facing traffic.

• Don't cut across lawns or go through backyards, parks and alleys.
• Don't hide or cross the street from between parked cars. Go to a corner to cross the street.

• Never accept rides from strangers. Don't take treats from a person in an auto.

• Use a flashlight when walking. Be sure it has fresh batteries.
• Wear light-colored costumes, short enough so you will not trip. Put reflective strips on them.

• Wear comfortable shoes that fit.

High heels or big floppy shoes are not safe for walking.

• Use face paint rather than a mask or hood that covers your eyes.

• Stay away from lighted candles, matches and open fires.
