see for themselves what the Planning Group is doing."

The Lower Colorado Region extended from Mills and San Saba Counties in the north to Matagorda County on the Gulf Coast, and includes cities bordering the Colorado River, such as Columbus, La Grange, Bay City and the rapidly growing Austin metropolitan area. Although the Colorado River is a major source of water in the area, many urban and agricultural areas use groundwater.

In each region, TWDB has appointed a planning group made up of representatives of 11 interest groups such as water districts, agriculture, the environment and small business, as well as of the geographic areas within each region.

Each planning group is charged with adopting and submitting a 50-year water supply plan for its region to TWDB by Jan. 2001. TWDB will integrate the 16 regional plans into a state-wide plan, assuring a consistent approach and reconciling any differences among regions.

Austin's transit authority has unanimously approved a proposal to build a light rail system that would serve the traffic-congested capital city in about eight years. Where the money will come from to fund the estimated half-billion dollar project remains to be decided.
