Views On Dental Health

DETECTING PERIODONTAL DISEASE

The major cause of tooth loss in adults is not dental decay but periodontal (gum) disease. Three out of four Americans are afflicted with it. Despite its propensity for dental mayhem, periodontal disease progresses silently at first. The changes are so subtle you can't feel them. Even routine dental examinations, cleanings and X-rays often miss it.

Adults over age 35 are the most likely to suffer from advanced gum disease, but children aren't immune. By age 13, four out of five children show some evidence of the problem. Warning signs include red or inflamed gums,

usually starting at the gumline, and gums that bleed easily.

A quick, painless test performed by your dentist called periodontal probing can detect early signs of the disease. It takes about 10 to 15 minutes using a calibrated instrument to measure hidden pockets of space between tooth and gum tissue. The readings are used for analysis and future comparison.
