Colorado County 4-H takes part in food show

Seven members of Colorado County 4-H clubs participated in the District 11 Food Show Saturday, Dec. 4, in Goliad.

There were four categories in the show: Main Dish (MD), Fruit and Vegetable (F&V), Bread, Cereal and Pasta (BC&P) and Nutritious Snacks (NS).

Participants compete in one of three age divisions: sub-junior, 8-10 years of age; junior, 11-13; and senior, 14-18.

Senior members who place first in their category advance to state competition held in June at Texas A&M University.

4-Hers competing in this event are currently enrolled in a Food and Nutri-

tion project. They completed a Food Show Record Form and prepared and presented a dish to a panel of judges.

Members gave a three minute presentation about their dish to the judges and answered questions about the food groups, nutrients and steps in preparing the dish.

ONYCHOMYCOSIS

Onychomycosis is a fungal infection of the nails that is difficult to cure. It is commonly acquired as part of an athlete's foot infection. Trauma or damage to the nail may predispose a person to developing onychomycosis. Mild infections cause little or no symptoms. In serious cases, the nail turns whitish, thickens, and detaches from the nail bed, and debris from the nail usually collects under its edge. Treatment depends on the severity of symptoms. Removal of the nail does not cure onychomycosis. Antifungal medications taken orally may alleviate symptoms and eventually cure the infection, but they cause side effects. Nails should be trimmed very short to minimize discomfort. Rubbing clotrimazole cream into the nail daily may control the infection.

Proper care for fungal infections and other foot conditions is vital to your program of overall good health. We have taken special attention to provide comprehensive care to manage foot and ankle problems as well as prevent them before they occur.
