Homes—

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BRIAN BALAS' residence, located at 308 E. State St., was originally built in 1907 by Keith for J.J. Whatley, a prominent rice buyer in the Eagle Lake area and one of the finest presidents of The First National Bank.

The Georgian-style mansion has the original hardwood floor in the formal living and dining rooms, and game room. Visitors should particularly note the hand-carved mahogany four-poster bed and armoire in the master bedroom. The 12-foot ceilings throughout the house give it a very spacious feel.

The original screened sleeping porches are now a glass-windowed breakfast area downstairs and walkin closet upstairs. These are the only major structural changes in the house since the turn of the century.

THE MAIN BUILDING of the Eagle Hill Inn & Retreat complex was built as a residence in 1937 by Hayes Stephens, one of Eagle Lake's most prominent citizens. The house featured every convenience and luxury known to the building trade at that time, such as central air and heat, remotely-controlled garage doors, elevator and underground lawn sprinkler system.

Visitors should particularly note the spacious rooms and convenient layout of the house. Also, the highquality materials used in its construction are very evident, as are the exquisite fittings and finish work.
