The study also showed that the racial makeup of Texas prisons has changed little since 1994. The inmate population currently is 44.2% black, 27.4% white and 25.2% Hispanic. Five years ago it was 47.1% black, 30.1% white and 25.1% Hispanic. The average inmate still has only a seventh-grade educational achievement score, the study stated.

And, the study showed inmates released last year had served an average of 3.8 years, a year longer than the average 2.8 years figured in 1994. Lower parole rates and more prison space have helped bump the average age of Texas inmates from 33 years old in 1994 to 35.4 years old in 1999.
