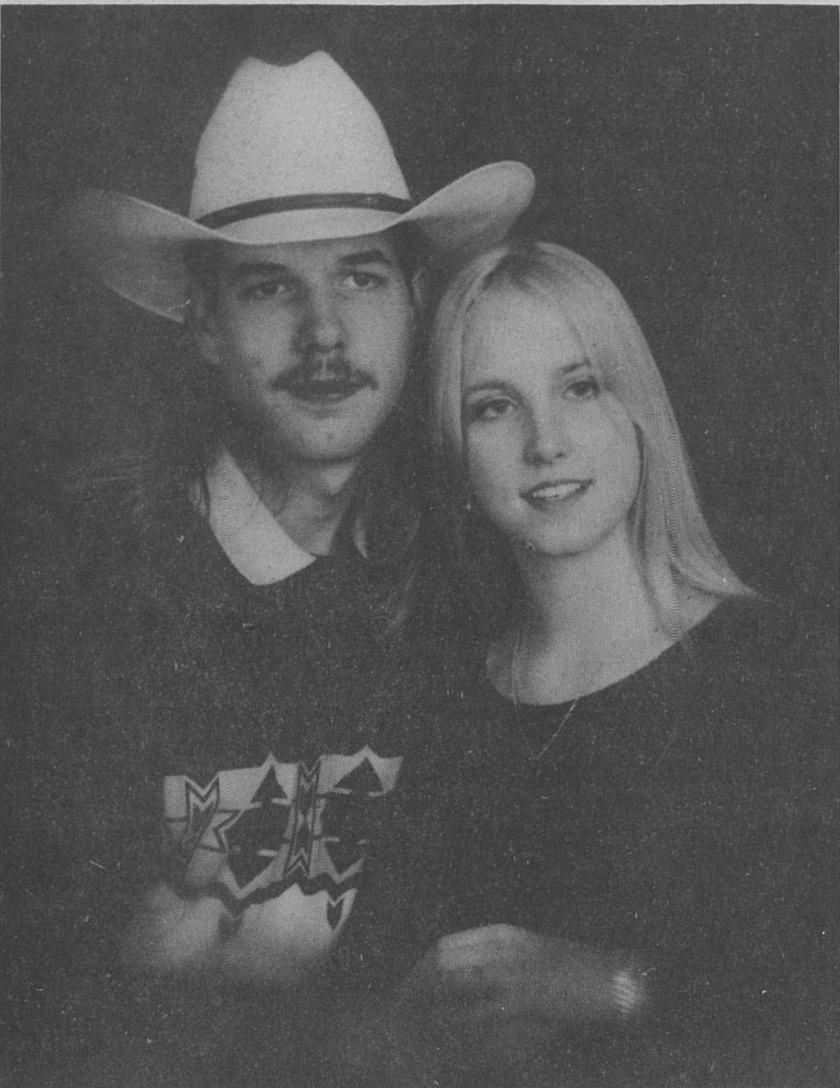

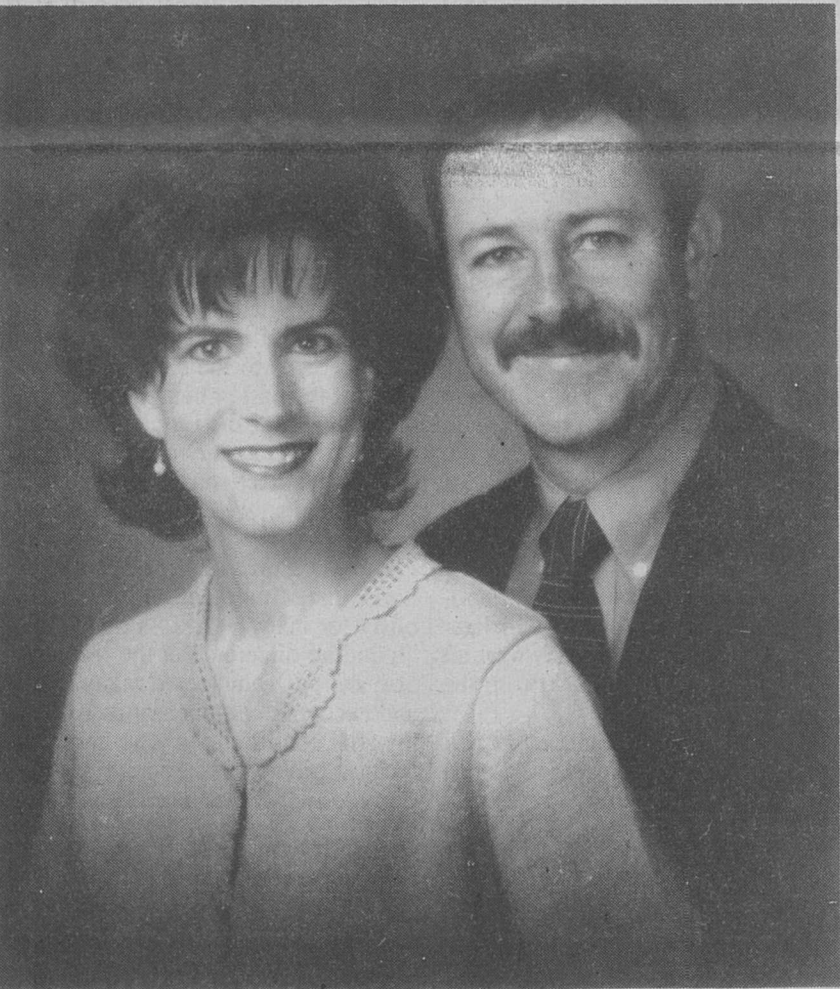

Foot Facts

PRONATING FLAT FEET

Being flat-footed is a common condition that usually causes no problems. If a person's feet are flat and also turn in, or pronate, however, physical difficulties could result. With pronation, the leg turns in, the heel and forefoot push out, and the inner ankle bulges. The pelvis and lower back may also become misaligned. Because of the stress on muscles, ligaments, and joints, a flat-footed person may experience overall fatigue and tired feet. Over time, untreated pronation can cause arthritis, bunions, irritation of the nerves, and other deformities. It can also make a person more susceptible to shin splints, as the leg must work harder to compensate for the pronation. Customized shoe inserts (orthotics) are often recommended for pronation.

The components of the foot and leg are designed to work together, sharing the tremendous pressures of day-to-day living. When they don't work properly, though, it can cause trouble for the rest of the body, and it's time to get help. P.S. Babies who appear flat-footed usually develop an arch as they grow.



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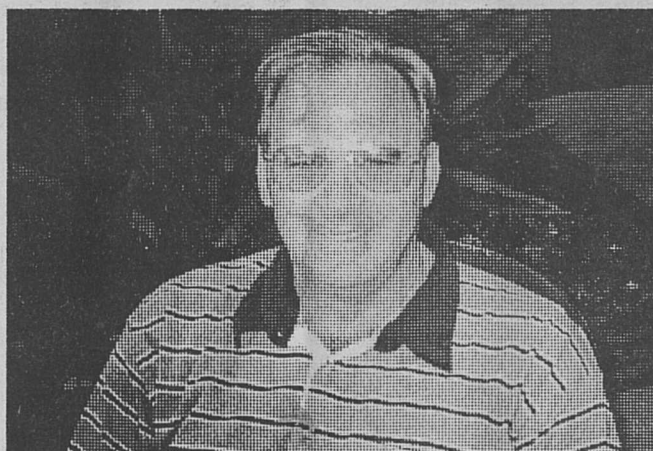
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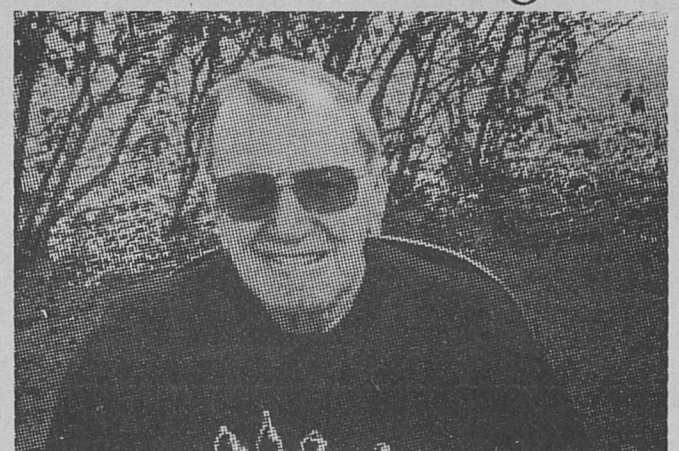
