The minutes were read and the treasurer's report given.

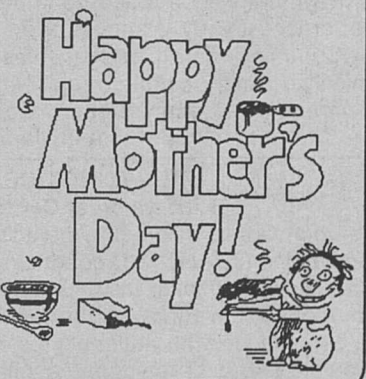
