Pete M. Urdiales

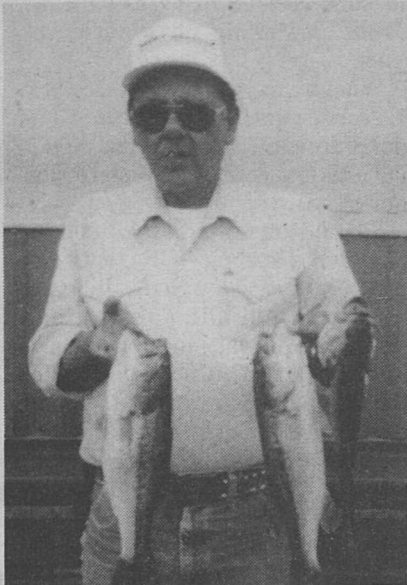

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Views On Dental Health

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ATTILA'S LAW

Attila's Law goes like this: If you hit anything long enough and hard enough with a big enough hammer, it will break. Most people seem to be using their teeth to test out Attila's Law. Every time we bite into something hard, we are creating dental mechanical stress. Because enamel is the hardest part of the body, the teeth do OK - most of the time.

Teeth are actually specialized gears which cut, mash and grind up food. Also, like gears, they can be overloaded, break down, need repair, and break down again.

The good machinist knows the health of his machinery and seldom expects it to perform above its capacity. However, every time we crush an ice cube or eat our health food nuts and grains, we risk tooth breakdown. The more unhealthy or weakened the teeth, the more the chance of damage - and the expense of repair.

Think about this: Your blender needs special blades to crush ice cubes - so please don't expect your teeth to do as well.

TOE DEFORMITIES

Many people have toe deformities, which can be present at birth or acquired in adulthood. Corns and calluses are common symptoms of toe deformities, since most result from excess friction. People with flat feet, high arches, or very long toes are prone to toe deformities because they must compensate for their unusual foot structure. Hammertoes, mallet toes and claw toes are common problems that occur when a toe joint buckles, forcing the affected toe to remain in a bent position. Hammertoes and mallet toes affect specific joints, while claw toes affect all three toe joints. Bone spurs are growths of excess bone on a toe. Overlapping and underlapping toes cause irritation from the deformed toe pushing into adjacent ones.
