

#### Alcohol Abuse: The Search for Better **Treatments Continues**

The excessive consumption of alcohol can have a significant negative effect on the physical, mental, and social lives of those affected. Worldwide the problem of alcohol abuse results in costs of more than a quarter trillion dollars a year from increases in crime, accidents, and alcoholrelated illness. Heavy alcohol drinking can lead to liver disease, psychological problems, certain cancers, and a blunting of the body's natural response to stress. Heavy drinking usually is defined as 2 to 4 or more drinks a day.

Treatment programs for problem drinkers employ a variety of approaches. The well-known "12-step" program is a standard psychological approach. The medicine Naltrexone (ReVia) works in an area of the brain to diminish or lessen the desire to drink. This medicine is approved to treat alcoholism, usually in conjunction with behavior modification therapy. Italian researchers, in both animal and human studies, have found that Baclofen (Liroesal), a muscle relaxer, reduces alcohol withdrawal symptoms and craving for alcohol. Clinical studies with nalmefen (Revex), a narcotic receptor blocking medicine, has shown promise in preventing relapse among heavy drinkers.
