



Mental illness is found in persons of all ages, races, cultures and economic conditions. In Texas, 1999 statistics indicated there were nearly 2.94 million individuals - nearly one in six - with some form of mental illness. Education Over 655,000 Texas children, from birth through age 17, can be identified as having an emotional disturbance. Over 660,000 - or about one in 30 -Texans have depression, manic depressive disorder or other depressive for disorders. Nearly 200,000 - about one in 100 - Texans experience schizophrenia disorders and about 30,000 new cases occur each year.
