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Views On Dental Health
WHAT CAUSES GUM DISEASE?

The major cause of periodontal disease (an advanced form of gum inflammation) is dental plaque. Plaque is a collection of bacteria that grows on food particles, tissue cells, and saliva that clings to the surface of the teeth. When plaque is allowed to build up, the gums become infected and inflamed. Slowly, the irritated gums pull away from the tooth and form pockets. These periodontal pockets trap more plaque, causing more tissue to become diseased. If this process continues, even the bone around the tooth root deteriorates, which results in loosening and premature loss of teeth or widespread infection.

If plaque isn't removed regularly, it can harden to form tartar, the calcified plaque that dentists call "calculus". Tartar is a barnacle-like, yellowish deposit that can only be scaled from teeth and from under gums by professional cleaning. Tartar itself can speed up the progress of periodontal disease which is the leading cause of tooth loss in adults.
