Making Progress on the Treatment of Headache

National Headache Awareness Week is June 4 - 10. There are three common headaches.

Tension headaches are caused by muscle tension in the head, neck, and shoulders. The pain is usually steady, moderately severe, and occurs first above the eyes or in the back of the head. Temporary relief of pain is often achieved with over-the-counter (OTC) medicines such as acetaminophen, aspirin, or ibuprofen. Migraine headaches are recurrent, throbbing, and intense, and occur on one or both sides of the head. They may begin suddenly or be preceded by an aura (definite symptoms) 10 to 30 minutes before the actual pain. OTC medicines such as Excedrin Migraine or Advil Migraine provide relief for many. Stronger prescription medicines such as sumatriptan (Imitrex), zolmitriptan (Zomig), or narcotics may be required. Cluster headaches are less common and tend to affect mostly men over age 30 years. Attacks can occur suddenly and end within an hour. Sumatriptan sometimes provides relief but doesn't prevent future episodes. Dihydroergotamine (Migranal), methysergide (Sansert), and steroids are used to treat this headache type.
