The chances of dying of a bite are much greater for babies than adults. Often, the infant is killed while asleep or in a crib. The dog does not have to be of a large or aggressive breed; a 6week-old puppy mauled a 3-week-old baby while the father was asleep in the home in a small West Texas town.

Dog bites are a major, yet preventable, public health problem among children. No one knows why a normally friendly dog will act aggressively toward an infant who is too young to intentionally provoke an at-
