Fifth place was won by Russell Spalinger, Trey Maxwell, John Gimrd and Michael Duarte.

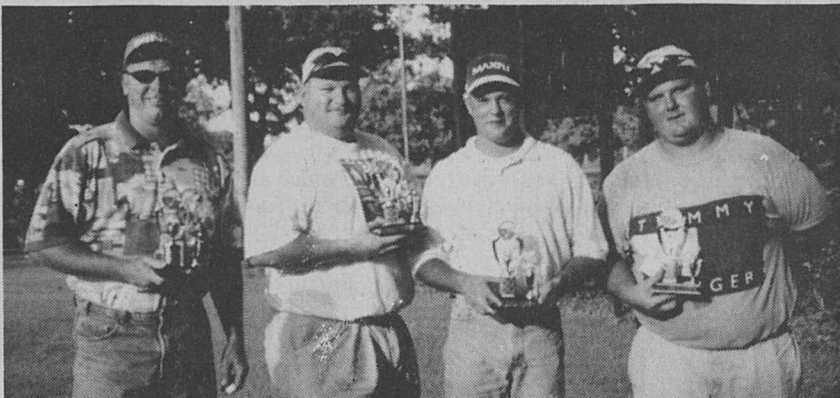
Gift certificates from Wal Mart in Columbus were awarded for the longest drive to Coy Sunderman and Stephanie Sunderman.
