## SENSITIVITY TO COLD OR SWEET

Sometimes, a patient will complain of pain while eating or drinking something cold or sweet. First, we'll check for a cavity or crack in the tooth's enamel. If it's deep enough, it could expose the dentin area above the nerve chamber, which is sensitive to sweets as well as temperature.

Another likely cause is receding gums. If the margin of the gum recedes below its normal position, it exposes part of the tooth that's not covered with enamel. This area contains nerve endings that can be almost as sensitive to temperature and sweets as the tooth's pulp.

It's important to brush these areas thoroughly, but it's also important not to brush them too hard, since improper brushing could cause further recession. Be sure to use a soft-bristle toothbrush and use a rolling stroke instead of brushing back and forth.

If you have a hypersensitivity problem, be sure to mention it during your next checkup. If it's really bothering you, don't hesitate to call for an appointment.
