

to you in the way I perceived it: "He was the little boy who was born of poor parents. His dad suffered from the depression, and they were not living too great. He was the little boy who placed a new home upon a little hillside, with his own hands, in a better part of town, and moved his dad and mom into it.

"I remember, I would look at him and I would look at me, and I would look at everyone else, and say to myself: "Boy, any kid who can do something like that for his parents has to be the greatest boy on earth." I worshipped him for that, and I always will.

Later, as you know, he built his own home, acquired land and in my opinion, produced one of the finest and prettiest home sites anywhere around Eagle Lake, Texas."

High school

The way I remember it, there were five unique people present at Eagle Lake High School during those years: 1. Mike Canaris; 2. Martin Hale; 3. Mrs. Lizzie Westmoreland; 4. Coach Rench; and, 5. I don't know if any of you remember him, but we used to call him "Ole' Bear Reed", he was our superintendent.

"To me, these five people lent something to Eagle Lake High that made it special among all others. The school would never have been the same without any one of them.

'Mr. Reed had a SPECIAL THING in this heart for Mike. I remember Martin Hale, band director and teacher, told me one time that he had given Mike a bad mark in one of his subjects.

"He said the "Ole Bear" called me down to his office one day and said (you know how he talked) "Martin, I outa twist your ears. I hired you to give these kids some learning, not to be a flunking 'em. Now get back up to your class room and start teaching like your
