The Texas 4-H Round Up was held June 12-16 on the campus of Texas A&M University in College Station. Texas Round Up is a 54-year-old tradition that was started to provide an experience for senior aged 4-H members to visit Texas A&M University and College Station.

Two Colorado County 4-H members were the District 11 representatives in the musical and illustrated talk divisions. Brandy Tuck of the Live Oak 4-H Club participated in the Companion Animal Illustrated Talk with her potbelly pig named Ricky. Tuck placed second and received a plaque and a \$500 scholarship.

The objectives of the Texas 4-H Round Up are to provide 4-H members with learning opportunities and educational experiences that support 4-H project work; to provide members the opportunity to compare the skills they have gained with those of other members and with their own previous performances; to provide members with an opportunity to develop and practice citizenship and leadership skills in a different environment; and to recognize the accomplishments of 4-H members and the support of volunteer adult 4-H leaders.

Waddle and Tuck were accompanied by 4-H Program Assistant Sharon Grahmann and 4-H Leader Beverly Tuck. County Agent Sally Garrett, Barbara Waddle, Betty Coreathers and Teressa Fitzgerald also attended the competitions.
