Foot Facts

ATHLETE'S FOOT

Athlete's foot, or tinea pedis, is a fungus infection of the feet that occurs primarily among teenage and adult males. The infection develops in moist, damp, and improperly ventilated conditions. Risk factors include sweaty feet, a warm climate, not drying feet enough after swimming or showering, and wearing tight shoes or socks. Athlete's foot affects each individual differently. Sometimes the skin between toes peels, cracks, and scales. In other instances, there is redness, scaling, and even blisters on the soles and sides of the feet. Itching may accompany these skin symptoms. Stubborn toenail infections can also occur and lead to scaling, crumbling, and thickening nails or even nail loss. Without treatment, athlete's foot can lead to a bacterial infection.

Self-diagnosis and treatment for problems such as athlete's foot may not always be in your best interest. Whatever problems you feet encounter, give them professional attention while they are still in their minor stages. It's much better, easier, and less costly to deal with problems early on than to face major treatment at a later date. Remember, foot problems usually don't disappear on their own. 
He has been sought after for revivals and annual day events throughout of Houston.
