# Prairie chicken shows response

Texas' most endangered bird, is showing a sight increase in numbers though the recovery is small and the population still fragile.

This once abundant bird, which numbered more than a million along a coastal belt across Louisiana and Texas, had declined to only 42 birds in two Texas counties last year.

The main cause for this decline, according to state wildlife biologists, is the loss of specialized coastal grassland habitat these birds require.

Last year, these facilities were able to rear more than 100 birds for release in the wild. "Once released on the range, these young birds have to contend with all the same environmental concerns as other wildlife including predation, disease and harsh weather," said Mark Klym, coordinator of the Adopt-a-Prairie-Chicken program at TPW.

"Last year, we had a particularly hard drought and many of the young birds died from starvation. We held some of the captive bred birds back and released them in late winter. All things considered, the increase in numbers is promising, and it shows that captive breeding and release can have a positive effect on this popula-




